

Requesting a New Feature by Creating a Support Case


To request features which require OpenAir Customer Support to change internal account settings, such as many features within the 🔼 Optional Features, you must create a Support Case in SuiteAnswers.

To request a new feature by creating a Support Case:

- 1. Sign in to your OpenAir account.
- 2. Click **Support** in the User Menu.
- 3. Click Go to SuiteAnswers.
- 4. In the "Ask a Question" sidebar under "Submit a Case", click Contact Support Online.



- 5. On the "Enter keywords related to your question" page, type the name of the feature you want to enable in the search field, and click Search.
- Click **Continue to Create Case...** above the search results.
- 7. On the "Create Case" form, enter the following information in the available fields:
 - In the "What would you like to do" dropdown list, select "Ask a question" or "Enable/disable switch".
 - In the "Case Severity" dropdown list, select "C3 How To / Non Urgent questions".
 - In the "Subject" field, type "Internal Switch [name of feature you want to enable]".
 - In the "Details" field, type the feature you want enabled, which accounts you want it enabled for (for example, Production or Sandbox accounts), and which Company IDs to use if you have multiple Sandbox accounts.
 - In the "Product Area" dropdown list, select "OpenAir Web Application".
 - In the "Feature" dropdown list, select "Switch Activation/Deactivation Requests".
 - Do not enter anything into the "Attach Document" field.
 - In the "Email" field, type your email.
 - **Note:** Requests to enable or disable account-wide features in OpenAir can only be processed when an administrator's email address is entered in this field.
 - In the "Phone (Optional)" field, type a phone number where you can be contacted if you would prefer OpenAir Customer Support contacts you by telephone. Please include your country code and enter the number without any spaces.



8. Click Submit.

When you have submitted the case, OpenAir Customer Support will contact you do confirm they have received the case, and will request additional information if necessary or guide you through any additional steps, such as setting up roles for the feature.


Accounting Period Functionality

By enabling this feature, separate accounting dates can be associated with most transactions, with reports drawing from these accounting dates. The ability to maintain separate accounting dates can be particularly useful when the original transaction date of an entity must be independent from the date, as signified by a financial report or general ledger application.

For example, the charges on an invoice dated July 5th may need to be associated with the month of June in the general ledger, as the charges were incurred in this month. The invoice transaction date would be 07/05/09, however, the invoice accounting date might be 06/01/09.

In another example, a receipt incurred in March may need to be posted to the financial system in June. In this example, the receipt transaction date might be 03/17/09, while the receipt's accounting date might be 06/01/09. The new accounting period functionality lets users to associate an additional independent accounting date with a transaction. Reports can then be configured to leverage the accounting dates, rather than the original transaction dates.

All Item Types in Calendar

By default, the type of items a user can see in the calendar depends on which modules this user can access. The following table lists the types of calendar items, and the application access required to view each item type

Item type	Access required
Bookings	Resources module
Time off requests	Timesheets module
Task assignments	Projects module
Work schedule	Account module

With this feature, employees can see their task assignments and bookings in the calendar even if they do not have access to the Resources and Projects modules. This lets you control access to modules that are not needed while enabling employees to see their full schedule in the calendar.



Note: Module access determines which type of user license is taken up by the employee. An employee with any combination of Account, Timesheets and Expenses application access takes up a Timesheets and Expenses (T&E) only license. An employee with any other application access takes up a Full user license. For more information, see the help topic Licenses.


Allow the Owner/Requester/Administrator to Upload Attachments for Approved Objects

This feature permits an owner/requester/administrator to manage the attachments for an approved object. Eligible objects include

- Authorizations
- Bookings
- Booking requests
- Deal booking requests
- Envelopes
- Invoices
- **Proposals**
- Purchase orders
- Purchase requests
- Schedule requests
- Receipts
- Timesheets

With this switch on, approved items can be downloaded, replaced, and deleted for the selected objects.

Assign Project Job Codes for Users on a Per Project **Basis**

This feature enhances the job code functionality to allow managers to assign different job codes to users based on the specific job function being performed on particular projects. These project job codes can be assigned per user in multiple areas of the application by configuring job code rules. These areas include bookings, time entry, project level assignment, and task assignment. The appropriate project job code will be assigned when time entries are saved.



After project job code rules have been configured, they can be linked to specific rate cards. Time billing rules can be configured to derive rates from rate cards. Thus, billing will occur based on the appropriate rate, as determined by the role an individual fulfilled for the project. Revenue recognition transactions generated from the As Billed revenue recognition rule will contain the appropriate job code assigned stemming from the hourly charges created by Billing Rules. The billing and recognition transactions list can be customized to include the associated project job code. For forecasting purposes, charge and revenue projections will use the assigned project job codes when using time entries, and calculate project job codes (through job code rules) when forecasting using billings or project/task level assignments.

In addition, invoice layouts can be modified to include "Project job code" as an invoice column and invoice grouping. To modify an invoice layout, users with the appropriate roles privileges, go to Administration > Application Settings > Invoices > [select an invoice layout].

"Assigned to" Column Filter in Tasks List

Use the column filter for the **Assigned to** column in the Project > Tasks list to list only those tasks that are assigned to a specific resource.

The **Assigned to** column filter is always visible. By default, it does not let you select a specific resource only the -All- metavalue is available in the column filter dropdown options. With this feature enabled, you can select a specific resource to list only those tasks that are assigned to the selected resource.



Note: When you click <number> incomplete tasks in the Home > Home (My Status widget), the tasks list appears and lists only those tasks that are assigned to you. The **Assigned to** column filter shows your name (the name of the authenticated user) even when this feature is not enabled. Clear column filters or select the -All- metavalue to revert back to listing all tasks in the tasks list and not only those tasks that are assigned to you.

Attachment File Drag and Drop

This feature lets you add attachments to projects, expense reports and receipts using file drag and drop. After you enable this feature, a new user interface for attachments appears on the project, expense report, and receipt properties forms. Like with the default attachment user interface, you can either attach multiple files from your computer or attach a single workspace document.

To add one or multiple files from your computer as attachments, drag the files to the file attachments box. The attached files appear in the file attachments box and include information about the file (file name, size, date and time uploaded, uploaded by).



Note: The date and time uploaded follows the preferred date format and time zone in your personal settings.

You can also drag a folder from your computer to attach all the files contained in the folder.

After the files are attached the following options are available:

- The number of attachments @ is indicated in the top right corner of the file attachments box.
- To download a single attachment, click the download icon \downarrow .
- To download all attachments as a Zip archive, click the download icon in the top right corner of the file attachments box **\psi**.
- To manage the current attachments, click the edit icon ...
- To delete an attachment, click the delete icon 🝵.
- To delete all attachments, click the delete icon 🝵 in the top right corner of the **file attachments** box.


Note: When you create a new project, expense report, or receipt, you can add attachments before you save the form. If you leave the form without saving the changes, the attachments will be saved in OpenAir as unassigned attachments. For more information, see Unassigned Attachments.

If you add attachments using file drag and drop to an existing project, expense report, or receipt, the attachments will be associated with the project, expense report, or receipt even if you do not save the form.

The form shows a maximum of 100 attachments for receipts and 1,000 for expense reports.



To attach a workspace document, select the workspace then select the document. To clear the selected workspace document, click on the clear icon \times .






Unassigned Attachments

When you create a new project, expense report, or receipt, you can add attachments before you save the form. If you leave the form without saving the changes, the attachments will be saved in OpenAir as unassigned attachments. The next time you open any of your projects, expense reports or receipts, the form will include an unassigned attachments box listing all the attachments that you uploaded and that are not associated with a project, expense report, or receipt.

- The number of unassigned attachments (4) is indicated in the top right corner of the unassigned attachments box.
- To associate unassigned attachments to the current project, expense report, or receipt, drag the files from the unassigned attachments box to the file attachment box.
- To associate all unassigned attachments to the current project, expense report, or receipt, click the arrow icon \leftarrow in the top right corner of the **unassigned attachments** box.
- To delete an unassigned attachment, click the delete icon 📋 .
- To delete all unassigned attachments, click the delete icon 🝵 in the top right corner of the unassigned attachments box.
- To download an unassigned attachment, click the download icon \downarrow .



Viewing and Deleting All Unassigned Attachments Uploaded to the Account

Account administrators can manage unassigned attachments added by all users on the account.

To manage the unassigned attachments, go to Workspace > OpenAir — Unassigned Attachments > Documents. The OpenAir — Unassigned Attachments workspace is created automatically when the first unassigned attachment is added to your account. Only account administrators can view this workspace.

To delete all unassigned attachments

- 1. Sign in to OpenAir as an account administrator.
- 2. Go to Workspace > OpenAir Unassigned Attachments.
- 3. Click **Download all documents**. A dialog appears.
- 4. Check the **Delete all documents** box.
- 5. Click **Download**. A page appears confirming that all documents in the workspace were deleted. The page also includes a link to a ZIP archive to download all deleted documents.



Tip: To save storage space, delete documents from the OpenAir — Unassigned Attachments workspace regularly.



Important: Attachments to an unsaved new project, expense report, or receipt are initially added in to the "OpenAir — Unassigned Attachments" workspace until the user saves the entity form. When deleting all documents in the workspace, you may delete attachments for projects, expense reports and receipts that users are currently working on. Make sure you time unassigned attachment deletion accordingly.



Attachment Viewer and Attachment Thumbnail

View thumbnails for BMP, GIF, JPG, PDF, PNG, and TIFF files, and preview BMP, GIF, JPG, PDF, and PNG attachment files directly from the project, expense report or receipt properties form, and from the expense report or receipt lists.

After you enable the Attachment Viewer and Attachment Thumbnail optional feature for your account:

- OpenAir generates a thumbnail image automatically when you add a new attachment or workspace document and if the file type is supported. The thumbnail is generated whether you add the attachment file or workspace document using the OpenAir UI, REST API, SOAP API or XML API. See Attachment Thumbnail Autogeneration.
 - **Note:** Review the current limitations:
 - Thumbnail images are generated for all supported attachment files you add throughout
 - Thumbnail images are not available for attachment and workspace document files added before the Attachment Viewer and Attachment Thumbnail feature was enabled for your account.
- If the Attachment File Drag and Drop optional feature is enabled for your account, OpenAir shows the thumbnail images in the attachments drag and drop section on the project, expense report, and receipt properties forms.




- You can add the Thumbnail column to the following lists.
 - Expenses > Expense Reports
 - Expenses > Expense Reports > [Select an expense report] > Receipts
 - Expenses > Receipts

The column shows a thumbnail for each attachment when the thumbnail exists, or a file type icon otherwise.

If there are more attachment thumbnails than can be shown in the column, the column shows a +<n> icon -2, where <n> is the number of additional attachment files for which thumbnails are not shown. The column shows as many thumbnails as can fit in within the width of the column up to 10 attachment thumbnails.

If there are no attachments for the expense report or receipt, the column shows a no attachment icon



- You can click a thumbnail to preview a BMP, GIF, JPG, PDF, or PNG attachment file directly from the project, expense report, or receipt properties form, and from the expense report or receipt lists. The attachment viewer shows:
 - 1. The file name and corresponding file type icon in the top bar.
 - 2. The attachment file preview.

Click the arrows on the left or right of the preview pane to view the previous or next attachment.

- 3. A toolbar with the following actions:
 - □ Click the download icon ↓ to download the attachment.
 - Click the window icon to open the attachment in a new tab or window.
 - **(i) Note:** You can also use action keys on your keyboard:
 - ESC Close the attachment viewer.
 - □ Left arrow View the previous attachment.
 - Right arrow View the next attachment.
- 4. A navigation bar showing thumbnails for all attachments to the expense report or receipt. Click a thumbnail to view the attachment in the preview pane.

The navigation bar and preview pane show a file type icon for most unsupported file types, a generic file icon no for other unsupported and unknown file types, no attachment icon mif there is an error with the attachment, such as a corrupted file, for example.



- Note: The attachment viewer uses the native browser PDF viewer to show a preview of PDF documents.
 - Most browsers let you view PDF documents in a browser tab using a native PDF viewer by default. You or your organization may disable the PDF viewing capabilities in the browser settings. When the native browser PDF viewer is disabled, the attachment viewer does not show a preview of the PDF document. Instead, it starts downloading the file automatically or lets you click **Open** to download the file to your device.
 - If you interact with the PDF viewer, you can no longer use the action keys to interact with the attachment viewer.
 - If the PDF viewer cannot read the document, the attachment viewer shows a reload button or nothing, depending on your browser.

Attachment Thumbnail Autogeneration

When the Attachment Viewer and Attachment Thumbnail optional feature is enabled, OpenAir generates a thumbnail image automatically when you add a new attachment or workspace document and if the file type is supported. The thumbnail is generated whether you add the attachment file or workspace document using the OpenAir UI, REST API, SOAP API or XML API.

- The thumbnail image is generated immediately (in a few seconds or longer, depending on the OpenAir system load).
- The thumbnail image is generated again when using you replace the attachment file or add a new revision of the workspace document.
- The thumbnail image is generated when using the copy/move document functionality for workspaces.
- The thumbnail image file for each attachment is stored in the same folder as the attachment file.
- The thumbnail image is deleted when the attachment is deleted, including when the attachment is deleted because the record it is associated with is deleted. The thumbnail image is restored when the attachment is restored.
- Thumbnail image files do not count toward your account storage limit.
- The smaller side of the thumbnail image is always 80px, the other side maintains the aspect ratio of the attachment file.
- Supported attachment formats and corresponding thumbnail image format.

Note: In the case of attachments added using the SOAP API or XML API, the attachment file is provided as base64-encoded data using the base64_data attribute.

Automatic Backup Service

The Automatic Backup Service (ABS) lets you set up a regular delivery of your company's OpenAir account data to an email address or SCP/SFTP server for safeguarding. Your data is compressed as a ZIP file and can be PGP encrypted for additional security. You can use this feature to download all of your company's OpenAir data and attachments.




Note: The Automatic Backup Service is a licensed add-on and must be purchased separately. To enable the Automatic Backup Service feature, contact your OpenAir account manager or OpenAir Professional Services.

Business Intelligence Connector

Connect your Business Intelligence tools directly to your OpenAir list and report data.




The Business Intelligence (BI) Connector feature gives you point and click access to OpenAir data from existing reporting, business intelligence, workflow, and integration applications.

The Business Intelligence Connector provides the following features:

- Publish reports and provide access to the report data from the BI Connector.
- Publish lists giving users real-time access toOpenAir data from the BI Connector. User access rights
 configured in OpenAir are enforced preventing access to data the user does not have permission to
 see. All essential object lists are supported.
- Role permissions are supported to give administrators control over who can publish data.
- Access to published reports are available using the NSOA.report.list and NSOA.report.data user scripting functions.
- Use published lists like custom queries and read the latest list data in your form and scheduled scripts with the NSOA.listview.list and NSOA.listview.data user scripting functions.

Note: The Business Intelligence Connector only supports the latest version of OData V4 / JSON (Open Data Protocol).

Conditional Dropdown Custom Fields


Add relational dependencies between two or more dropdown custom fields.

This feature lets you create value selection dependencies between two dropdown custom fields. The value selected in the first custom field will be able to limit the values shown for the second custom field. After

dependencies have been configured, the second custom field will dynamically appear on the form with the appropriate value choices. A single custom field can have dependencies with multiple custom fields. In addition to creating conditional dependencies between two custom fields, a value list editor is available. Leveraging drag-and-drop functionality, you can move the position of values within a single list.

After you enable or disable this optional feature, go to Administration > Global Settings > Account > Maintenance Settings, choose **Regenerate the custom field value list table**, and click **OK**.




Changes to Dropdown Field Value List Definition

When enabled, this feature changes how you set the list of values for dropdown fields on the custom field properties form. Use the following steps instead of entering a list of values:

1. Click the **Values** text area.

The New Field Values popup window appears.



- 2. Repeat the following for all values you want to add:
 - a. Click the + button to add a new value.
 - b. Enter a value and click **OK** next to this new value.
- 3. Click **OK** to save the values and return to the custom field properties form.

Custom Fmail Notifications

There are many events that can occur in OpenAir when it may be beneficial to send an email notification to a user. For example, when a user is assigned to a task within a project, the project manager may choose to notify the user of this assignment. Or, if a booking has been created for a resource on a project, the booked user may be notified of the booking. In some cases, it may be beneficial to send a notification based on specific criteria. It may also be helpful to send the notification to select users as well as customize the body of the email to include additional information about the event.

This feature extends existing email notifications functionality. Within each application setting, there is a new Notifications area where the criteria, recipients, and email body can be configured. For example, a notification may be configured such that a new booking notification will only be sent to the booked user if the booking type is set to **Requested**. In addition to configuring the criteria, users can be selected as recipients of the email. The email body can be customized to include additional text as well. Multiple notifications may be configured.



Note: email notifications are available in Application Settings for Expenses, Invoices, Projects, Resources and Timesheets. The notifications can be triggered by specific events — for example on booking creation, modification, deletion, approval, submission, rejection and approval request for the Resources application.

Custom List Layouts

Enable users to personalize the layout of any list that they have access to in OpenAir and to adapt the list layout to their specific needs. Create public list layouts that are available to all users in your company, and set a public list layout as the default list layout for new employees.

The list layout functionality lets you:

 Save multiple layouts for a list. This enables you to use a different list layout depending on the task you want to complete in OpenAir. Each list layout is associated with the object type or list it was created for. You may have one set of list layouts for timesheets, and another for expense reports, for example,

but you cannot apply a list layout that you created for timesheets if you are viewing a list of expense reports.

- Change the layout for the list you are viewing at any time. You can change the layout to either:
 - A list layout you created and saved.
 - A public list layout. Public list layouts are available to all users in your company.
- Depending on your access profile, you can create public list layouts that are available to all users in your company.
- Depending on your access profile, you can set a list layout as the default list layout for new employees.

The list layout saves the following parameters:

- Columns and column order See the help topic Selecting List Columns.
- Sorting options including the columns your list data is sorted by, and the sort level and sort order for each column — See the help topic Sorting the List Data.
- Number of rows per page see the help topic Other List Options.
- Column filters see the help topic Column Filters.
- **(i) Note:** The following list parameters are not saved as part of the list layout:
 - Column lock and column totals settings.
 - Advanced filters. You can save advanced filters separately. See the help topic Advanced Filters.



Display Contacts in "Last Name, First Name" Format in Drop-down Menus

This feature changes the contact display format to "Last name, First name" in dropdown menus, instead of using the default "First name Last name" format.

Display Incomplete Tasks on Dashboard

Enable this feature to show the number of open or incomplete tasks in the My Status and Company Status portlets on the homepage.


Depending on your implementation and use of OpenAir, you may not need the status portlets to show the number of incomplete tasks. For example, if you are using tasks mainly to manage access to timesheets and expenses, you may accumulate a high number of open or incomplete tasks over time. Showing a high number of incomplete tasks in the status portlets impacts the performance of the homepage. Excluding this information should improve loading time for the homepage.

Display the Booking's Requester Name in "Last Name, First Name Middle Name" Format in Reports

This feature displays the booking's requester name as "Last Name, First Name Middle Name" format in reports.


Edit Exchange Cross Rates

Enable this feature to let account administrators edit the cross rate table.

When enabled, the cross exchange rates (forex table) can be modified. If you have entered a currency override rate in the "Set Exchange rates" form, this will take care of the FUTURE rate. If date ranges outside the current dates are entered the forex table will automatically be extended to cover those ranges. The extensions will be done using the current PAST or FUTURE rates dependant on the direction of the extension.

To edit exchange cross rates, go to Administration > Global settings > Organization > Currencies > View exchange rates, click the Tips button then click **Modify the exchange cross rate table**.


Enable Integration with NetSuite

This feature enables an account to be integrated with NetSuite. When enabled, you will see the option "Integration: NetSuite" on the Administration > Global Settings page. Click to access the NetSuite Integration form.


Tip: Using this feature adds many settings to the Tips button under the NetSuite Integration Administrator option.



As of October 17, 2015, a new, more user-friendly NetSuite integration UI is also available.



Important: Enabling this switch will invalidate all of your existing mappings. After enabling the switch, you will need to re-setup all of the mappings again. We strongly seeking assistance from PS when requesting this UI. We also advise first re-checking your existing mappings before setting up the new mappings.

Enforce Column Filter Value Search

Column filters with a high number of distinct values have an impact on list performance and usability. A solution is to stop distinct values being loaded when users open the column filter, to enforce a search for matching column filter options and to limit the number of matching values returned to 1000. This solution can be applied to selected column filters on request. It can be particularly useful for project or resource name columns, for example.



Note: This feature is built in for the Tasks column filter. To show the list of options in the Tasks column filter, type at least 3 characters in the search box and press Enter.. It is optional for all other column filters.

To stop distinct value dropdown options being loaded for selected column filters:

- 1. Identify and list the column filters with high number of distinct value dropdown options.
- 2. Contact OpenAir Customer Support and ask for the **Enforce column filter value search** feature to be enabled for the column filters identified in step 1.

(i) Note: This setting will apply to the specified column filters across all lists on your account.

This performance optimization feature modifies the user interaction for the specified column filters:

- 1. When clicking the column filter dropdown, a message appears instead of the usual dropdown options.
- 2. To show the list of options, type at least 3 characters in the search box and press Enter. OpenAir returns a list of up to 1000 values containing your search string.
- 3. If there are more than 1000 matching values in the database, only the first 1000 values are returned as search results and a message appears above the search results. Refine your search until there are less than 1000 matching values.
- 4. To filter the list of values returned by your last search, type any number of characters in the search box BUT do not press Enter. The list of values is filtered as you type with matching strings highlighted in bold.



Note: Filtering as you type only takes into account the values returned by your last search. If your initial search matched more than 1000 values in the database, only the first 1000 values were returned and are available for filtering. Other matching values may exist in the database but are excluded as there were not returned in the last search. You should refine your search until there are less than 1000 matching values (step 3) before filtering the search results.

5. Select the desired options to set the column filter.

Extended Character Set Support for List Sorting and Filtering

This optional features corrects sorting and filtering issues that may occur in lists when using characters that are not in the basic Latin alphabet set of characters.

By default, OpenAir supports the ISO basic latin alphabet (26 characters A-Z) for sorting and filtering in lists. This may not be suitable for localization and international usage, depending on the set of languages used for your company's OpenAir data. In particular, it is not suitable for languages that use:

- An extended Latin alphabet that includes additional characters using diacritics or ligatures. For example, the German alphabet includes one ligature (ß) and three diacritics (umlauts — Ä, Ö, and Ü).
- A non-Latin script.


Enable this feature to extend character support for sorting and filtering in lists to the Basic Multilingual Plane in the Unicode standard. This adds support for most commonly used language character sets.



Important: This feature uses data conversion that may impact the performance of lists. Lists may load more slowly after you enable this feature.





Feature-Specific User Satisfaction Feedback Form

We use an optional feedback form to gather feedback about specific features. It helps us gain understanding and improve the features usability and user experience in future.

The feedback form is currently enabled for the following features:


- Advanced resource search
- Consolidated resource profile
- Expenses module
- Outline, Gantt and task detail view
- Project center
- Receipt attachments UI
- Resource compare view

The feedback form appears after the user has interacted with the feature several times. For example, users will be asked for feedback after running several searches on the Advanced Resource Search, updated profiles several times using the Consolidated Resource Profile, or loading the Compare view several times.


Users can opt out of the survey either by selecting the **Don't show me this feedback form again** option on the feedback form or by selecting **Disable feature-specific survey form** in Personal settings. Users can opt in again later by changing the preference in Personal settings.

The feedback form consists of a simple satisfaction question, asking users to rate the feature on a scale.

Users can postpone answering by clicking Show me later or closing the popup window, and the feedback form will pop up again 30 days later.



If the response is either negative (Somewhat dissatisfied / Extremely dissatisfied) or neutral (Neither satisfied nor dissatisfied), users are prompted for additional optional feedback.



After the user submits the form, a message displays to thank users for their feedback and the answers are stored. Users will not be prompted again for feedback on the same feature unless significant changes have been made to the feature and feedback is required to measure whether these changes have improved the feature for end users.

The feature-specific user satisfaction responses data can be downloaded using Administration > Global Settings > Account > Integration: Import/Export > Export All data in MySQL format or Administration > Global Settings > Account > Automatic Backup Service.



Note: The feature-specific user satisfaction survey can be disabled for your account. To disable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Global Search

Search and quickly go to any of the create actions, lists, tools and settings pages accessible from the navigation menu, or search for a customer, project, employee or resource.

The Global Search feature brings together navigation suggestions, personal shortcuts and modern search.

You can access the global search from any page by clicking the red search icon in the upper-right corner or pressing s on your keyboard.

The global search page initially shows navigation suggestions and your navigation shortcuts side-by-side. The suggestions and shortcuts are replaced with search results when you start entering a term in the search bar.

You can search for:

- A navigation menu item (main navigation and create menu) For example "timesheets" or "create timesheet".
- A customer, project or employee (resource) record.

The search functionality uses rotated search hints, rapid type-ahead, synonym-matching, and integrated business objects to help you construct search phrases and find what you're looking for even if you don't know what it's called in OpenAir.

The search results show only the areas and information that you have access to.

For more information about using the global search, see the help topic Getting Started with Global Search.

Account administrators can control global search settings and perform maintenance tasks. To do so, go to Administration > Global settings > Account > Global search.

The global search settings page lets account administrators:

Choose whether to add global search coverage for additional item types in your company's account as and when this coverage becomes available.



Note: In OpenAir 2024.2, global search coverage is limited to navigation items (main navigation and create menu), customers, projects and employees (resources). These item types are always available using the global search and it is not possible to remove coverage for these object types.

As and when we extend global search coverage to additional item types in future, coverage for each additional object type will be optional. Account administrators will be able to add or remove coverage for these additional object types in your company's account.

 Update the information available for an object type in the global search functionality. To do so, locate this object type and click **Synchronize**.

The data synchronization is gueued and progress information (percentage) or the date and time the last synchronization completed is shown on the page.

Object data synchronization may be required when:

- A new navigation item or create action is introduced in your company's account by a new release or by a change in your account configuration. In this case, you must synchronize navigation items before you can search for the newly introduced navigation items and create actions.
- We make changes to the information that you can use to search for objects. This may be the case, if we add additional information you can search objects by, such as the news feed status to search for projects, for example.
- We make changes to the way object data is indexed to improve the search functionality.
- You change your account terminology. In this case, you should synchronize all item types that are impacted by the terminology changes so that these changes are reflected in search results.
- There is a problem with the global search functionality, such as missing results. If this is the case, updating the information may help to resolve the problem.



(i) Note: If global search coverage includes coverage the object type, the global search object data is updated automatically if an object is added, deleted, or if any of the information available for search is modified.

The global search object data is deleted automatically if you disable the Global Search feature for your company's OpenAir account. It is updated automatically if you enable the Global Search feature again.

The global search object data for a specific object type is deleted automatically if you disable all access to the application that includes this object type. It is updated automatically if you enable access to the module again.





Custom field types supporting inline-editing include Checkbox, Date, Dropdown, Pick list, Text, and Text area.



Multicurrency


The Multicurrency feature provides support for transactions in currencies other than your default currency. For example, the feature lets you reimburse employees expenses, invoice customers, recognize revenue, and run reports in multiple currencies. After you enable the feature, you can:

- Set the different currencies your company uses for transactions.
- Set a **Currency** for all relevant entity records and work with multiple currencies in OpenAir.
- Download historical currency cross rates as a CSV file.

Additional optional features also give you access to advanced multicurrency functionality, for example:

- The ability to modify historical currency cross rates. See Edit Exchange Cross Rates.
- The ability to define arbitrary custom currencies for reporting purposes. See User-Defined Reporting Currencies.

To enable the Multicurrency feature and discuss advanced multicurrency functionality, contact your OpenAir account manager or OpenAir Professional Services.



Note: You cannot disable the feature after you create transactions and records that rely upon it.

All OpenAir accounts include the capability to create expense receipts in any of the systemsupported currencies even if all your business transactions are done in the default currency for your account. You only need to enable the Multicurrency feature if your business uses more than one currency for transactions.

Multiple Schedule Exceptions Per Day by Time Off Requests

Companies often have varying holiday policies that allow for half or partial working days that occur the day before an official holiday. For example, some companies will allow for a half day the day before Christmas. In such a case, some employees may choose to take the rest of the day off as part of their personal time off (PTO).

For accounts that have the company setting "Automatically create schedule exceptions when a time off request is approved" enabled but don't have this feature enabled, a company schedule exception could be entered for the half day. However, for the user to take the rest of the day off, an exception on the user's work schedule would need to be manually created. With this feature, users can enter a time off request even if there is an existing company schedule exception for the same day.

If there is an existing company schedule exception for partial hours, users can create and submit a time off request for that same day (available time permitting). In addition, users can create and submit multiple time off requests for the same day.



Note: It is not possible to manually create more than one schedule exception on the same day for a company work schedule or an individual user level work schedule.

Next-Generation Homepage

View up to 12 sections of information across three content regions in the next-generation homepage.



(i) Note: The next-generation homepage is an optional feature. To enable the feature in your company's account, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

When enabled for your company's account, the next-generation homepage is available in addition to the classic homepage because it does not yet offer a new solution for all the classic homepage functionality.

The to-do list introduced in OpenAir 2024.2 includes all workflow tasks from the Reminders portlet on the classic homepage, and some workflow tasks from the My status portlet. Workflow tasks in the My status portlet for which you cannot take direct action are not included in the to-do list. For more information about the to-do list, see the help topic To-do list.


Go to Home > Home (new) to view the next-generation homepage. The larger of the three content regions (primary region) shows sections of information as tabs that you can explore one by one. The smaller (secondary) content regions let you view two additional sections of information that are always visible on your homepage, on the right of, or below the primary region.

In OpenAir 2024.2, the next-generation homepage supports two types of content:

- List You can show the most important information from a list on your homepage. Homepage lists have the following differences with full-page lists:
 - The list toolbar and page navigation are not shown for lists on the homepage.
 - Each list on homepage is limited to one page of list data. You can control the maximum number of rows shown when setting up the list for your homepage, or modifying the list setup.
 - Lists on the homepage do not support inline-editing even if the full-page lists for the same object type supports inline-editing.
- Report You can show data from one of your reports on your homepage.

Account administrators can copy the next-generation homepage setup from one user to other users using the bulk employee change wizard. For more information, see the help topic Next-Generation Homepage Setup.

You can personalize the next-generation homepage, and add, reorganize and change the content in each region to suit your own business needs. For more information, see the help topic Getting Started with the Next-Generation Homepage.



Overlapping Timesheets and Envelopes at the Role Level

With this feature, you can allow different roles to have access to the Overlapping Timesheets and Expense Reports feature.



Note: Only account administrators and users with the View Help Center role permission can access the product access panel.

Proxy Approver Notifications

Add proxy approvers as recipients in notification email messages about new transactions awaiting approval.

Employees with the role permission Create own proxies can designate proxy employees who will be able to log in and perform a function on their behalf. If the proxy employee can approve transactions on behalf

of the proxied employee and the Proxy Approver Notifications feature is enabled, the proxy employee receives notification email messages when a transaction is submitted for the proxied employee's approval.



Note: Proxy approver notifications are sent only to proxy employee designated as a proxy by the proxied employee.

Proxy approver notifications are not sent if the proxy employee was added by an account administrator or a user with the relevant role permissions on the proxied employee's employee

Publish Shared Reports using BI Connector

Publish your shared reports with owner or recipient access privileges and take control of the data you've published.



With this feature, shared reports can be published with the same data access privileges as the report owner, or restricted to the access privileges of each report recipient.

The report owner decides when they publish the report, and the administrator controls the publish policy with role permissions.

When publishing reports with recipient permissions, each recipient must then publish the shared report data from OpenAir into their business intelligence tool. To access the report, recipients must have either the **Download Reports** or the **Publish Reports** permission to access the report in their business intelligence tool. The data recipients see in the business intelligence tool will be limited to what their own respective privileges allow.



Note: This feature enables the Enable publishing of shared reports to OData service with **owner's permissions** role permission, which allows users to publish shared reports.

Query Builder


Use the Query Builder feature to create complex and customized notifications for events throughout OpenAir.

Query Builder notification conditions are organized into groups which each contain a condition statement such as "if all of the following conditions are true" or "if none of the following conditions are true". A notification is sent when the conditions you've created are met.



Important: Conditions with groups can only be created with this feature enabled. If you later disable this feature, notifications created when this feature was enabled will be deactivated if they contain groups.

To create a notification using Query Builder:

- 1. Go to Administration > Application Settings > [Select the module settings which requires a notification1 > Notifications.
- 2. Click the Create button and click the type of notification you want to create under "New". The new notification form appears.
- 3. Enter a "Rule name" for the notification. This name will appear in the Notifications list.
- 4. In the "Send a notification ..." section, click the dropdown list and select the appropriate condition statement. The following condition statements are available:
 - If ALL of these conditions are TRUE
 - If ALL of these conditions are FALSE
 - If ANY of these conditions are TRUE
 - If ANY of these conditions are FALSE
- 5. Click the ADD CONDITION button to add new conditions to condition statement. Click the ADD GROUP button to add a new condition statement to which conditions can be added.



Note: You can also add conditions to a group using the + icon under the group's condition statement.

- 6. In the "Notify" section, select who the notifications should be sent to when triggered.
- 7. In the "Email message" section, enter the subject of the email which will be sent when the notification is triggered, and any text you would like to have in the Email body. Use the "Field" dropdown list to add variables to the email body.
- 8. In the "Other" section, select "Active notification" to allow notifications of this type to be sent.
- 9. Click Save.

To delete a group or condition in Query Builder:

1. Click the delete is icon next to the condition or group you want to delete.

To move a group or condition to a new location within the guery in Query Builder:

1. Click the licon on the left of the group or condition and drag it to a new location within the guery.



Quick Audit Trail for Global Settings


Custom Field Extended Audit — Audit information is supported for all custom field types. Redesigned Administration Module

This feature introduces a redesigned page header with tab navigation and an overview page for each global settings and application settings section in the Administration module.

The tab navigation lets you go from one page to another without going back to the main overview page. The main overview page listing all global settings pages is now replaced with overview pages for each global settings section (Organization, Display, Users, Account, Jobs, Rates, Reports, Customers, Custom Fields).

Redesigned Advanced Filters

Gain usability and canvas space when viewing, modifying or managing advanced filters.

The Redesigned Advanced Filters optional feature changes the user interface for advanced filters on redesigned lists. The redesigned advanced filters panel is compact and lists filter conditions horizontally instead of vertically. It lets you select and apply saved filters directly from the list toolbar instead of the flyout panel.

It may bot always be appropriate to copy some information stored in custom fields, as duplicate information on receipts, charges, bookings, billing rules, and tasks could create problems. You can prevent the information stored in these custom fields from being copied across by checking the **Never clone, repeat, duplicate or copy this field** box on the custom field properties form.


Single Sign-On Integration Leveraging SAML

The SAML Single Sign-On (SSO) feature lets you use an external identity provider service to manage user access to your company's OpenAir account using the Security Assertion Markup Language (SAML) protocol. SAML enables single sign-on (SSO), a scheme that allows users to sign in to one application —

the identity provider — and automatically have access to separate applications — the service providers — without having to sign in to each of these other applications separately. It provides a method of secure integration with existing, on-site authentication infrastructures without exposing these services to direct public access, and enables federation of user identity across any number of additional services. SAML works well as a transport for LDAP and other popular authentication back-ends.

The SAML Single Sign-On feature lets you:

- Configure the SAML Single Sign-on feature to work with multiple identity providers.
- Review configured identity providers from a list.
- Configure the profile and upload the metadata XML file for each identity provider.
- Set any identity providers as active. Only active identity providers can be used for service provider or identity provider initiated single sign-on.
- Select one default identity provider. Service provider initiated single sign-on request are sent to the default identity provider when using the OpenAir sign-in page for single sign-on users.



Suppress Email Notifications or Add Addresses to **Notifications**

Users can selectively choose to suppress email notifications when they make changes to bookings, issues, tasks, and projects. For example, a user may not want for a minor modification to trigger an email. To

suppress email notifications, when in the edit form of the associated entity, select a box indicating that email notification is suppressed. An email will not be sent to the notification list. Set up a custom field in each entity for the suppress email notification option and it displays in the associated edit forms.



Additionally, users can send notifications to additional recipients who may or may not be OpenAir users. These users may include those who may not routinely be notified of task or issue changes. Enter the email addresses in the text box for "E-mail addresses to cc" on the Edit tasks and Create or Edit issues forms. This text box displays the feature is enabled.

To-Do List

View a list summarizing items that require your action from any area of OpenAir.

Your to-do list is available from any page in OpenAir.

To view your to-do list, click the to-do button that is located under the create button in the upper-left corner.



The to-do list is a summary of workflow tasks, that is, tasks that require action from you as part of a workflow or business process. Each entry in the to-do list shows the number of items, the type of items, and the action required for these items.



(i) **Note:** The to-do list includes all workflow tasks from the Reminders portlet on the classic homepage, and some workflow tasks from the My status portlet. Workflow tasks in the My status portlet for which you cannot take direct action are not included in the to-do list. Click an entry in the to-do list to go to the corresponding item list and complete the action. After you complete the action for all items, the action is removed automatically from your to-do list.

The to-do list can include the following workflow tasks:

- Items that you need to approve.
- Open items that you need to submit for approval.
- Rejected items that you need to verify and submit again for approval.
- Authorizations against which you need to submit expenses.
- Approved purchase request items for which you need to issue a purchase order, and in some cases, identify a vendor.
- Incomplete tasks that you are assigned to, or booked for.
- Unresolved issues (action items) that you are assigned to.
- Timesheets submitted or approved by a proxy user that you need to review and confirm.




Unexport Records from a Specific Application by UI

OpenAir lets you mark records as unexported using bulk actions in lists, OpenAir API or Integration Manager. Record types supporting this feature include timesheets, expense reports, invoices, and revenue recognition transactions. You can also mark the parent, child, or both records as unexported (for example invoices only, charges only, or invoices and charges).

To enable specific users to unexport records, go to Administration > Global Settings > Users > Employees > [select an Employee]. In the respective sections (for example Timesheet Options), check the option **The** employee can mark [timesheets] exported.

Use Days Instead of Hours for All Time Entries

Enable this feature to use days instead of hours for time entries.

After you enable this feature, go to Administration > Global settings > Work schedule > [select schedule] and change the value for "Work days per day for this company work schedule" from "7.5" or "8" to "1", for example. This should be done for every work schedule, especially those where the number of associated employees is more than zero.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.



Important: You should not enable the Timesheets setting **Enable start and end time entry** on timesheets when the feature Use Days Instead of Hours for All Time Entries is enabled.

If you enable Enable start and end time entry on timesheets, when users enter a start time and end time in timesheets, the duration is calculated in hours and not converted to days.

User-Defined Reporting Currencies

Enable this feature to create user defined currencies for reporting in the Multi-currency tab.

After you have added the currency symbol, name and rate in the Multi-currency tab, the user defined currencies will be available for reporting but not for data entry and will have both the symbol and name displayed in the currency drop-down and report views.

When enabled, go to Administration > Global Settings > [Organization] Currencies > Multi-currency.

Wrap Text in List Cells

You can select to wrap long text and text area field values on multiple lines in list cells with this or display it in truncated form on a single line.

Single line (Default) — By default, redesigned lists display text and text area field values on a single line by default. Line feeds are removed to show more information. lists are more compact. If the entire

text does not fit the cell, only part of the text is displayed with ellipses to indicate the text is truncated. To view the full text, point to the cell or click **Read more** inside the cell (for longer text content).



Wrap text — If the Wrap Text in List Cells feature is enabled for your account, OpenAir wraps long text and text area field values on multiple lines in list cells. Lists are less compact. For longer text content, only part of the text is displayed with ellipses to indicate the text is truncated. To view the full text, click Read more inside the cell.



Longer text area cell content is truncated whether the wrap text option is enabled or disabled. To view the full text, click **Read more**. The full text appears in a popup box. Click the close icon \mathbf{x} , press the Esc key or click outside the box to close the popup box and return to the list.

- Note: These display options do not apply to the description column in the following lists. The entire cell content is always shown and line feeds are supported.

Automatically Create Overlapping Timesheet

Auto-create overlapping timesheet for second part of the week at month end. This feature requires use of the 'Prevent the entry of time for different months on single timesheet' feature.

Automatically Receive PDF Attachments of Approved Timesheets and Expense upon Approval

Employees within a company may need to download a hard copy of their approved timesheets or expense reports. For example, on occasion, hard copies of expense reports will need to be attached to invoices that are being sent to a customer. Without this feature, users can download a PDF version of the report from within the timesheet or expense report.

With this feature enabled, users can automatically receive a PDF attachment of the approved timesheet report or expense report. A PDF view of the report will be attached to the email notifications for approved timesheet and expense reports.

Calculate Remaining Hours Using Approved Hours Instead of Worked Hours

Enable this setting to calculate hours remaining as estimated hours minus approved hours, instead of estimated hours minus worked hours.

Configure Time Entry Rounding at the User Level

Time entries can be entered on a timesheet in different increments. For billing purposes, it may be necessary to round these time entries depending on contractual agreements. For some companies, certain groups of users may need different rounding rules applied based on their location. Currently, time entry rounding rules are applied at the account level for all users. OpenAir enables you to configure the time entry rounding option on a per-user basis.

Filter Timesheet Report by Project


Project approvers who have the ability to view multiple projects on one timesheet report can use the "Project filter" to view hours for a specific project. The timesheet report refreshes and displays only the hours for the project selected. This provides a quick way to ascertain the number of hours on a timesheet applied against a specific project.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Line Item Rejection in Timesheets

Use line item rejection in timesheets to streamline operations. Instead of delaying the invoice process because of an error in one time entry, reject the entry in question and continue to process the timesheet and invoice the already approved entries. This permits users and managers to save time for approvers while viewing individual entries.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.





Note: If timesheet rules are configured, administrators can choose to have the rule ignored upon the resubmission of rejected time entries. To enable this option, go to Administration > Application Settings > Timesheets > Timesheet rules. Check the option **Ignore rules on** submission of timesheets with individually rejected time entries and save. Users will not see warnings or errors for timesheet rules if submitting a timesheet that contains rejected time entries.

Prevent Entry of Future Time at the User Level

Users can log time that has been worked on different projects in OpenAir. However, for compliance purposes, managers may want to have their employees only enter time for the current week's timesheet and restrict the ability to enter time entries for future dates. Other existing functionality prevents all users from entering time for future dates. If your company policies allow some users to enter time for future dates, but not others, you can prevent time entry for future dates on a per-user basis.

Proxy Confirmations

The Proxy User feature lets proxy user sign in on behalf of another user to either submit or approve a timesheet. Allowing users to proxy in as other users may prevent delays in the billing process. For compliance purposes it may be required that the original submitter or approver of a timesheet confirm acknowledgment that the proxy action has taken place.

For example, if Mary Adams was on vacation and Bill Carr submitted her timesheet on her behalf, Mary Adams would need to confirm the timesheet to acknowledge that Bill submitted it on her behalf. This feature enhances the proxy capabilities to allow users to view which timesheets need to be confirmed by them due to proxy submission or approval.

When enabled, existing role settings will need to be modified to allow for timesheet confirmations. All newly created roles will have the option enabled automatically. To modify a role, go to Administration > Global Settings > Users > Roles > [select a role]. Select the option View confirmed timesheets.

- A new dashboard link, X Timesheets awaiting your confirmation, under the Reminders section will indicate to the user that there are timesheets waiting for their confirmation. When clicked, users will be brought to the **Confirmed** tab in the Timesheets list.
- A new tab for "Confirmed" is now available under the Timesheets tab. If there are timesheets waiting for confirmation because of a proxy submission or approval, those timesheets will be listed under the sub-links "Submitted waiting my confirmation" or "Approved waiting my confirmation". The "All" sublink will list any timesheet that needs to be confirmed by a user. Timesheets that are bolded indicate timesheets that specifically need attention from that user.
- As part of the timesheet "Approval history", timesheets will have an additional status of [Confirmed], [Confirmation reject], or [Confirmation pending] to indicate that some confirmation action is needed or has been made.
- For auditing purposes, the Timesheets detail report now contains the report values "Submission" confirmed by" and "Approval confirmed by" to indicate who confirmed the timesheet. Additionally, two additional filters for "Submission confirmation status" and "Approval confirmation status" have been added to filter results based on the confirmation status of timesheets. For example, managers can run the report and filter on "Confirmation Pending" to view all timesheets that have not yet been confirmed by anyone. To access the Timesheets detail report, go to Reports > Detail > Timesheets.

Self-Rejection of Timesheets

When an employee submits a timesheet prematurely and wishes to make changes, the process required the entire timesheet to be rejected by an approver - whereupon changes can be made. With this feature, users can reject their own timesheet, thus eliminating the need for approvers to reject unnecessary incorrect timesheets.

Users will have the ability to reject their own timesheets if no approvals have occurred. When rejected, the timesheet will be moved to the "Rejected" status where the user can modify specific time entries and resubmit for approval. The approval history for that rejected timesheet will indicate that the owner has rejected the timesheet, and include any explanation.



Note: If line item rejections are enabled and specific line items on a timesheet have not been approved, each line item can be rejected by the timesheet owner.



Note: Approved timesheets cannot be rejected. Users can only reject their own timesheets if they haven't been approved or rejected already by an approver.

Set the Timesheet Duration At the User Level

This feature permits your users to set their own timesheet duration, overriding the default duration.

Time Entries Match Task Assignments

When this feature is enabled, if a user submits their timesheet they will receive an error if the time entry date is not within the task's start and end date (inclusive) range.

This is a account-wide setting that can be overridden on a per-task basis by the selection of a checkbox custom field.

Time Entry Grid Filtering

Use a hierarchy filter to limit the number of Customer:Project entries that display on a timesheet grid. Different types of hierarchies can be created for geographic locations or business units, or even for types of work or other characteristics that make sense for your company. When all users can view all projects, this feature helps reduce the size of these lists, making them more manageable. Select the setting for using the hierarchy as the primary project drop-down filter and assign projects to a hierarchy node. When a user specifies a node on the timesheet grid, the projects within that hierarchy are easy to locate.

Use Zero Hours Rather than Planned Hours for Users' "Hours Remaining" Estimates

This setting uses "0" for "Hours Remaining" estimates rather than using planned hours. This setting only affects project outline and lists.


Expenses

The following optional Expenses features are available in OpenAir. Some features require OpenAir Customer Support to enable them for you.

- Adjust an Approved Expense Report

Adjust an Approved Expense Report

This feature permits a user with the **Adjust approved envelopes** role to create 'offsetting receipts' in an 'adjusting envelope' by running the Adjust selected receipts bulk action. This can be used, for example, to zero one or more receipts in an approved envelope.



Configuring this feature requires the following settings:

- Approval of envelope adjustments
 - Always require approval for adjusted envelopes
 - Do not require approval for adjusted envelopes
 - Require approval for adjusted envelopes only if net reimbursement amount is not zero
- Accounting date of adjusted envelopes
 - Adjusted envelopes have accounting date set by accounting date rules
 - Adjusted envelopes have accounting date of original envelope
- Accounting date of receipts in adjusted envelops
 - Adjusted envelope receipts have accounting date of original receipt
 - Adjusted envelope receipts have accounting date set by accounting date rules



Note: Envelopes with net negative totals cannot be exported to systems that do not expect negative transactions, such as NetSuite. This may affect your usage of the expense report adjustment feature.



Automating Tax Location

When using input tax on expenses, one expense item could be taxed using several different tax locations depending on where the expense was incurred. For example, an expense item of "Meals" may be taxed at 10% in Germany, 15% in France and 20% in the UK. Expecting an employee to select the correct tax location for every expense item is unreasonable. Furthermore the list of tax locations from which to pick in enterprise international accounts can become long and with no filtering or defaulting by employee extremely cumbersome to use.

To ease expense entry and minimize user error, OpenAir can default a tax location for a receipt based on:

- The expense item
- The geographical location in which the expense was incurred (defaults to the user's home location)



With this feature enabled, a user can (1) mark where a specified expense was incurred and (2) OpenAir can then automatically calculate the correct taxes based on the home location of user. The user can override this calculation if necessary.




Note: The calculation fields are highlighted if the user overrides the calculation. The user can reset back to the calculated values by clicking the **RESET TO DEFAULT** button.

To setup this feature your administrator needs to:

- **Administration > Application Settings > Tax Locations** Create the required tax settings.
 - **Note:** You should use this for tax settings and not for tax locations.
- **Administration > Application Settings > User Locations** Create the required user locations.

Administration > Application Settings > Expenses > Expense item - Fill out the new grid to match **User location** to **Tax location** combinations for the expense item.



Foreign Currency Receipts in Expense Grid

When creating an expense report that contains foreign currency receipts, by enabling this feature users can now enter and view information for all foreign currency receipts in the Expense Grid. The Expense Grid displays different currencies and associated exchange rates for the receipts. When the grid is saved, amounts are converted to the expense report default currency for reimbursement and will appear in the default currency on the expense report. If company settings allow, exchange rate amounts can also be modified in the Expense Grid.


Note: If company settings mandate that the receipt currency match the envelope or user's default currency, the Exchange rate for foreign currency receipts is displayed as read-only. The ability to modify exchange rate information is also based on the company Foreign currency receipt type selection. To select the Foreign currency receipt type, users with required role privileges can go to Account > Company > Settings > Expenses Options and select either "Modifiable exchange rate based on the current date," "Non-modifiable exchange rate based on the receipt date," or "Non-modifiable exchange rate based on the receipt date. Ignore rate overrides."

Access All Tasks

By default, employees can only enter time or expenses against the tasks that are assigned to them. When enabled, this feature allows employees to access, and to enter time and expenses against all tasks in the projects they have access to.



Important: This feature and the Close a Task for a Specific Employee for Timesheets and Expenses optional feature are mutually exclusive. It is not possible to enable both features for your account. See also Close a Task for a Specific Employee for Timesheets and Expenses.


Consider all implications carefully before you enable this feature. When enabling this feature, ensure that employees only have access they need using all access control features. For more information about access control, see the help topic Configuring and Using Access Control.

Additional Functionality for Expense Policies on Per-Project Basis

OpenAir enables you to limit expense items on a per-project basis. Configuring expense policies on a per-project basis permits companies to dictate different policies based on the work being done. Work performed in different countries may have different policies for projects. Expense policy functionality has been further extended to include additional expense policy options at the project level.

With this feature, you can define what expense items can be selected on an expense report based on the project selection. This feature also adds a new expense policy description field where you can describe a particular project's expense policy.



Adjust Planned/Assigned Hours Based on Actual Work

Project managers can assign hours for specific individuals assigned to the task in OpenAir. Often, managers will compare the number of hours that have been assigned against the number of hours worked thus far. As work is being done on the task, it is beneficial for managers to run accurate forecasting reports based on actuals.

For forecasting, it is ideal to have past planned/assigned hours updated to equal the approved hours. Without this feature, updating the planned/assigned hours accordingly is a manual process. With this feature enabled, OpenAir can streamline the process for updating planned/assigned hours based on actual worked hours on a per-task and per-user basis. Planned/assigned hours in the past are adjusted to equal approved hours and future planned/assigned hours can be re-cast in three different ways.



There are three ways to re-cast future task assignment hours:

- 1. Adjust end date of the task or tasks, keeping current users' allocation
 - Percent of user's time will not be changed
 - End date will be moved so that future planned hours equals remaining unworked hours
- 2. Keep end date of tasks, adjusting users' allocation
 - End date will be preserved
 - User allocation will be adjusted so that future planned hours equals remaining unworked hours
- 3. Task is finished. Remove remaining planned hours

Allow employees with appropriate permissions to add project based items when they do not have permission to modify the project

This optional feature lets employees with appropriate role permissions add project based items even if they do not have permission to modify the project.

By default, to add a project based item, employees:

- Must have the permission to modify the project. They must have any of the following:
 - Role permission View and modify projects.
 - Role permission View and modify existing projects, but not create new projects.
 - Explicit permission to modify a specific project controlled by the Allow only the project owner or administrator or the selected employees to edit the project option on the Project properties form (Projects > [Select a project] > Properties).
- Must have the appropriate role permission to view and modify, or to modify and create the project based item. For example:
 - View and modify issues, to add an issue.
 - View and modify budgets, to add a transactional budget.
 - Create and modify project billing rules, to add a project billing rule.
 - **Modify and create recognition rules**, to add a recognition rule.
 - **Modify and create recognition transactions**, to add a recognition transaction.

With this optional feature enabled, employees only need the appropriate role permission to view and modify, or to modify and create the project based item. Permission to modify the project is no longer required.

Allow Users to Unapprove Budgets

Give selected users the power to unapprove budgets. To enable this feature for a user, go to Administration > Global Settings > Users > Employees > [Select a user ID], scroll to Projects Options, select the "Allow the employee to unapprove a project budget" option, and click Save.

To unapprove a budget, go to Projects > Projects > [Select a project] > Project budgets > [Select an approved project budget] > click the edit icon, and click Submit/Approve. In the Approval History page, click the "Click here" link in the unapprove message to unapprove the budget.


Apply Phase Filtering in Time Billing Rules

You can create extensive project plans that include phases, sub-phases, and tasks in OpenAir. For companies that have large project plans and leverage the existing task filter on time billing rules, it may

be beneficial to have all newly created tasks picked by billing without the need to manually add the new task to the billing rule filter. For example, there may be a phase in the project plan called "Billable" and any task within that phase should be picked up for billing and all other tasks outside of that phase should not.

Without this feature, these tasks would need to be added to the Task filter within the time billing rule. In addition, any new task that is created under that phase would need to be manually added to the filter. You can also set up time billing rules to filter by phases. If a phase is selected in the filter, all tasks that are a part of that phase will be processed by billing. In addition, if a parent phase is selected, all tasks within that parent phase as well as any sub-phases will be picked up by billing.

Automated Search Engine for Booking Creation

This feature lets project manager assign generic resources to projects and tasks, or define the required skill set (assignment profile) for each project or task, then search for matching resources and select the resources to book. After the project manager selects the resources to book, OpenAir will:

- Create bookings automatically for the best matched resources based on search results.
- Initiate the booking approval process.
- Substitute generic resources for specific resources automatically when the bookings are approved.

Example 1. Example of use

As a project manager, you would typically work through the following steps:

- 1. Create a project plan with tasks.
- 2. Assign generic resources to tasks. You can also select an assignment profile for each task if the Project Assignment Profile optional feature is enabled for your company's OpenAir account.
- 3. Launch the generic resource booking search. The search returns the best matching resources.
- 4. Preview search results and select the resources you want to book.
- 5. Select the option to create and submit the bookings for approval automatically.
- 6. OpenAir creates the bookings and initiates the booking approval process.
- 7. After a booking is approved, OpenAir replaces automatically the generic resource with the specific resource booked.

Note: The Resource Booking Approvals optional feature must also be enabled for your account. See Resource Booking Approvals.

To let project managers search for resources based on the required skill set instead of generic resources, enable the Project Assignment Profile optional feature. See Project Assignment Profiles.


Automatically Add New Users to Assignment Groups

Companies that leverage assignment groups are able to assign a group of users to certain projects and tasks for time and expense entry. This is beneficial for assigning all employees in the company to internal projects such as time off or administrative projects. Currently, any new user that is created will have to be manually added to any applicable assignment groups.

OpenAir can use a more streamlined process for assigning newly created users to specified assignment groups. Specific assignment groups can be designated to automatically include any new user. If a particular assignment group has been flagged, any new user that is created will automatically be added to that assignment group.

This behavior only applies to newly created users and not existing users that have been updated.

Customer Contact Information in Project **Properties**

This feature lets you identify key customer contacts at the project level.


- You can select and edit existing contacts, or add new contacts on the project properties form. When you select an existing contact, the contact information (Name, email, phone number, etc.) appears in the project properties form.
- You can add contact information in projects lists and on tabular (detail) and crosstabbed (summary) reports. The following table lists the supported contact fields:

Close a Task for a Specific Employee for Timesheets and Expenses

Restrict named employees from entering or submitting time or expenses against a task.

When enabled, the following boxes are available for each assignment row on the task properties form:

- **Closed for timesheets** Check this box to prevent the employee assigned to the task from doing either of the following:
 - Entering time against this task The task is not available for selection when the employee adds a new time entry.

- Submitting a timesheet including time entries against this task When attempting to submit the timesheet, OpenAir returns an error advising the employee that the task is closed.
- Closed for expenses Check this box to prevent the employee assigned to the task from doing either of the following:
 - Entering expenses against this task The task is not available for selection when the employee creates a new receipt.
 - Submitting a timesheet including time entries against this task When attempting to submit the expense reports, OpenAir returns an error advising the employee that the task is closed.


This enables account administrators and users with the necessary role permission to restrict named assignees from entering or submitting time or expenses against the task. This is may be helpful when a project manager does not want assignees to submit time or expenses against the task after their work on the task is completed.

Important: Review the following guidelines:

- This feature and the Access All Tasks optional feature are mutually exclusive. If employees can access all tasks and can enter time and expenses against all tasks in projects they have access to, the Close a Task for a Specific Employee for Timesheets and Expenses optional feature cannot be enabled. For more information about the Access All Tasks feature, see Access All Tasks.
- The Closed for timesheets or Closed for expenses are not available if your company's OpenAir account is configured to use a scrolling picker to assign employees to tasks.
- Depending on your company's OpenAir account configuration, the task properties form may include a Allow all users to log time and expenses to this task checkbox. If the Allow all users to log time and expenses to this task box is checked, checking the Closed for timesheets or Closed for expenses has no effect – the assignees are still able to enter and submit time or expenses against the task.
- The OpenAir Mobile and OpenAir OffLine add-on services support this feature. To ensure full support, you should check the **Show only clients and projects with open tasks assigned to** the employee box on the Administration > Application Settings > Expenses > Other Settings and Administration > Application Settings > Timesheets > Other Settings.



Control Editing Submitted Entities by Approvers via Role Permissions

By default, account administrators can control whether approvers can edit submitted items awaiting their approval using the relevant application settings.

With this feature, account administrators can control which approver can edit submitted items awaiting their approval using role permissions.

Date Filters Support for Incurred Vs. Forecast Revenue Recognition Transactions

Include only the approved time entries, approved expenses and fulfilled purchase items for the specified date range when generating revenue recognition transactions using 'incurred vs. forecast' recognition rules.

You can use this feature, for example, if you run revenue recognitions for the previous month (for example, November) a few days into the current month (for example, December 6) and you only want to include approved time entries, approved expenses and fulfilled purchase items for the previous month (for example, November 1–30) in revenue recognition transactions.

- With this feature enabled, only the approved time entries, approved expenses and fulfilled purchase items entries up to and including the specified end date (for example, November 30) will be included in revenue recognition transactions.
- If the feature is not enabled, revenue recognition transactions include all approved time entries, approved expenses and fulfilled purchase items up to and including the date you run the revenue recognition (for example, December 6). This may include not only approved time entries, approved expenses and fulfilled purchase items for the previous month (for example, November) but also for the current month up to the date you run the revenue recognition (for example, December 6).

Default Options on Task Assignment

Establish default values for task assignment custom fields for new tasks. Easily update any of the default values for some or all project tasks using the task assignment change wizard. This feature saves an enormous amount of time and effort. When default values associated with a user or group are entered, they automatically populate on each task to which the user or group is assigned. In addition, as changes become necessary, they can be made to multiple tasks at one time.

To use this feature, go to to Projects > Create new form. Enter the form information and Save it. Then, in the Projects list, select a project. Select "Task assignment" from the Phases/Task dropdown. Next, enter the default information for each resource or group who will be assigned to a task in the new project, and click Save. Finally, create phases and tasks for the project. The default task assignment custom fields are displayed, and when resources are assigned, the default resource information automatically populate the custom fields.

Define Charges to Recognize in "As Billed" Revenue Recognition Rules


You can recognize revenue based on various criteria in OpenAir. Specifically, the "As billed" revenue recognition rule permits companies to recognize all revenue generated from charges. This feature adds functionality to allow users to configure each as-billed rule to recognize revenue based on the invoiced status of charges as well.

Estimate to Complete (ETC) and Estimate at Completion (EAC) in Project Budgets

See what impact your planning has on the final project price.



This feature adds Estimate at Completion (EAC) and Estimate to Complete (ETC) columns to your budgets' total columns in the budget, actuals, and compare views. When you save changes to your budget, the EAC and ETC fields update to account for the changes.

- Estimate to Complete The Estimate to Complete (ETC) is used for forecasting the funding needed to finish the project at any point. The calculated value includes all planned budget values from the pivot date until the last project budget entry. The pivot date is set in Administration > Application Settings > Projects > Project Budget Options.
- Estimate at Completion The Estimate at Completion (EAC) is used for forecasting the overall cost of the project. The calculated value includes all actual budget values before the pivot date and Estimate to Complete values from the pivot date until the last project budget entry. The pivot date is set in Administration > Application Settings > Projects > Project Budget Options.

ETC and EAC values can also be used in several types of crosstabbed and detail reports. In addition, you can use the Inception to Date (ITD) field in reports:

Inception to Date – The Inception to Date (ITD) is the amount of money spent from the beginning of the project until today, or until the pivot date set in Administration > Application Settings > Projects > Project Budget Options.

This feature also allows you to set a baseline budget which is used as the main point of comparison against a project's actual data and other budgets for that project in reporting. A budget with any type of status (open, approved, submitted, archived) can be marked as a baseline.



Note: Each project can only have one baseline budget.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support. This feature also requires the Project Budgets feature.

Exclude Project from Charge Projections

Exclude selected projects from charge and recognition projections.

To use this feature, create a custom field and use the following custom field settings:

- Add a custom field to (Associated record type): Project
- Add a field of this type(custom field type): Checkbox
- Field name: exclude_from_projections
- Display name: Exclude project from charge and recognition projections

For more information about creating a custom field, see the help topic Creating and Modifying Custom Fields.

After you have created the custom field, to exclude a project from charge or recognition projections:

- 1. Go to the project properties form (Projects > Projects > [Select a project] > Properties).
- 2. Check the Exclude project from charge and recognition projections box.
- Click Save.


Hide the Project Progress Bar

The % complete progress bar can now be hidden in projects for the whole account. This is useful for customers that don't use the % complete metric and calculate project progress in another way.

Hide the Daily, Weekly, or Monthly Resource Planner Options

Use this option to hide the Daily, Weekly, and Monthly options in the Resource Planner.




To enable this feature, go to Administration > Application Settings > Resources > Other settings and select any or all of the following options:

- Disable daily option in resource planner.
- Disable weekly option in resource planner.
- Disable monthly option in resource planner.

Inline Editing, Drag-and-Drop Functionality, and **Enhanced Gantt Layout**

Reorder tasks by dragging them to new positions or create dependencies from one task to another. Use inline editing to change the task name or predecessor.



For Project Outline view:

- In-line editing of task name, ID, predecessor or start and end dates
- Reorder of task, phase, milestone by dragging to new positions
- Modify order of columns by dragging to new positions

For Gantt view:

- Set dependency by dragging from one task to another
- Drag task to different date or chance start or end date
- Outline view and Gantt as one view



New "Booking Type" Filter in Revenue Recognition Rule

You can recognize revenue on a per-project based on different rules and criteria in OpenAir. The Incurred vs. forecast rule permits revenue to be recognized based on how the project is progressing against the project plan. Revenue is recognized by dividing the incurred costs by the forecasted costs, multiplied by the revenue that is to be recognized. The incurred and forecast costs can include a combination of labor, expenses, bookings, or purchases.

OpenAir enables you to include a booking type filter leveraging bookings in the forecasted cost calculation. This may be beneficial if the forecast option is configured to use "Approved and booked hours multiplied by user cost" option and would like to exclude bookings that have a booking type of "Tentative" from the calculation.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.



One Project Per Expense Report

At times, companies may only want users to enter one project on an expense report for invoicing purposes. In addition to the expense policies options, users now have the ability to restrict an expense report to one project. With this feature enabled, when users create an expense report, the customer:project selection is done at the expense report level. All subsequent receipts created will be associated with that customer:project.

When the project has been selected, the customer:project dropdown will be read-only on the receipt form and locked on the expense worksheet.



Note: If the selection for the customer:project is modified at the expense report level after receipts have been entered, all receipts will be changed to the new customer:project. Since a new customer:project is now associated with the receipts, the expense items and task selection will be cleared from the receipts.

Optionally View and Assign Revenue Hours for **Recognition Transactions**

Typically, an "As billed" or "Time project billing" recognition rule is created to generate the total revenue amount based on hourly charges. In addition to seeing the total recognized revenue, it is beneficial to view the total recognized hours specifically for transactions generated from hourly charges. This feature adds two enhancements to the revenue recognition functionality which allow users to view and modify revenue hours for recognition transactions.

The ability to display the revenue hours for each recognition transaction has been enabled for all accounts. To disable the display of revenue hours, users with the appropriate role privileges go to Projects > Projects > [select a project] > Financials > Recognition. Select the "As billed" or "Time project billing" rule and clear the **Populate hours in recognition transactions** box. This functionality can be disabled on a per rule basis. At times it may be necessary to create a manual transaction with varying revenue hours or edit an existing system generated transaction. For companies that allow users to manually create revenue recognition transactions, time (in hours and minutes) can be entered for each transaction.




Note: Form permissions have been added to the revenue recognition transaction form. Time for existing recognition transactions can also be modified.

Pagination for the Task Worksheet

Break the task worksheet into separate pages to increase performance and make large amounts of information more manageable.



To set the number of tasks which appear in a Task Worksheet page:


- 1. Go to Administration > Application Settings > Projects > Worksheet Display.
- 2. In the "Number of paginated rows to display" field, enter the number of tasks you want to show on each page. Clear the field to disable this feature.
- 3. Select "Enable sorting on columns ID and Task name" to allow users to sort these columns alphanumerically in ascending or descending order.
- 4. Click Save.



Phase/Task Filter in "Incurred vs. Forecast Rule"

With this feature enabled, the Projects > [select Project] > Financials > [create Incurred vs. forecast rule] form shows Phase/Task instead of Task in the **Recognition rule filters** section.

Portfolio Projects and Subordinate Projects

This feature lets you:

- Designate projects as portfolio projects See Designating a Project as a Portfolio Project.
- Create multiple subprojects within a portfolio project See Designating a Project as a Subordinate Project Within a Portfolio Project.
- Create billing rules that apply to the portfolio project and all subprojects within the portfolio project.
 - By default, all Time, Expense item and Purchase item billing rules created for the portfolio project apply automatically to all subprojects when billing runs for the portfolio project.
 - When creating a billing rule for the portfolio project, you can use the Project filter to apply the billing rule to selected subprojects only.
 - A note appears at the top of the billing rules list for subprojects if there are any applicable billing rules at the portfolio project level. The note includes a link to the portfolio billing rules list.
 - The billing transactions list for the portfolio project shows the billing transactions generated against the portfolio project and all subprojects within the portfolio project. Add the Project column to the billing transactions list to identify against which project the transaction was generated.
 - **Note:** A separate optional feature lets you use customer POs to apply a single billing cap across all subprojects or across selected subprojects in a portfolio project. See Single Billing Cap Across Multiple Subprojects Within a Portfolio Project.
- Create recognition rules that apply to all subprojects within the portfolio project.
 - By default, all As billed, Expenses, Purchases, and Time recognition rules created for the portfolio project apply automatically to all subprojects when recognition runs for the portfolio project..
 - A note appears at the top of recognition rules list for subprojects if there are any applicable recognition rules at the portfolio project level. The note includes a link to the portfolio recognition rules list.
 - The recognition transactions list for the portfolio project shows the recognition transactions generated against the portfolio project and all subprojects within the portfolio project. Add the Project column to the recognition transactions list to identify against which project the transaction was generated.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.



Important: After you designate a project as a portfolio project or subordinate project and transactions are recorded against this project, it is not possible to remove the portfolio or subordinate project designation. You should test this feature extensively on a sandbox account to make sure it meets your business requirements, before you enable the feature and start using it on your production account.



Designating a Project as a Portfolio Project

This feature lets you designate an existing or a new project as a portfolio project.

To designate a project as a portfolio project:

- 1. Do one of the following:
 - For an existing project, go to Projects > Projects > [Select α project] > Properties.
 - For a new project, click the Create button and Projects > New ..., enter all the properties for
- 2. Choose **Is portfolio project** under the Portfolio designations section of the project properties form.
- 3. Click Save.



Important: After you designate a project as a "portfolio" project and transactions are recorded against this project, it is not possible to remove the portfolio project designation.

Designating a Project as a Subordinate Project Within a Portfolio Project

After you designate a project as a portfolio project for a customer, you can designate multiple projects as subprojects within that portfolio project.



Tip: Add the Portfolio project column using the list columns panel to identify subprojects and include a link to the portfolio project associated with each subproject in your project lists.

To designate a project as a subordinate project:

- 1. Do one of the following:
 - For an existing project, go to Projects > Projects > [Select a project] > Properties.
 - For a new project, click the Create button and Projects > New ..., enter all the properties for the project, and click Save. A new project must be saved first before you can designate it as a subproject.
- 2. Choose **Is a subordinate project of** under the Portfolio designations section of the project properties form and select the relevant portfolio project from the dropdown options.

Click Save.



Important: After you designate a project as a subordinate project and transactions are recorded against this project, it is not possible to remove the subordinate project designation.

Prevent Invoicing and Revenue Recognition on a Per-Project Basis

Often times, companies may create projects and have users begin work on a project before there is a signed contract. In addition to having users log time and expenses to the project, accurate billing and revenue forecasting is necessary for these types of projects. However, since these projects are considered to be at risk projects, invoicing, revenue recognition transaction, and revenue container creation should be prohibited for these projects.

OpenAir enables you to designate specific projects that should prevent invoicing and revenue recognition creation. If a project has the option enabled on the project properties form, users will not be able to create invoices, revenue recognition transactions or revenue containers for that project until that option has been disabled. However, billing rules, revenue recognition rules, charge and revenue projections, project billing transactions, and charges can be created for the project.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Prioritize Recorded Time Over Booked Time for Charge and Revenue Recognition Projection

This features lets you use recorded or approved time entries exclusively for charge and revenue recognition projection on a given day when time entries exist for that day. The calculation ignores any time booked to any project or task for the same resource on that day.

After you enable this feature, go to Administration > Application Settings > Projects > Charge projections. The charge projections settings show two additional options.

- Approved and booked hours (ignore booked hours if worked or approved hours are logged)
- Worked and booked hours (ignore booked hours if worked or approved hours are logged)


With both options, OpenAir uses booked time to calculate the charge and revenue recognition projection on a given day for a given resource, only if this resource has not recorded any time against any task or project on that same day. If a resource has recorded time entries for that day against any task or project, only the approved or recorded time will be used for charge and revenue recognition projection. If the resource is booked to any other projects or tasks on the same day but has not recorded time entries against these other tasks or projects, the booked time will be ignored.

Project Assignment Profiles


The Project Assignment Profiles features lets project managers define the required skill sets for project and task assignments. These skill sets can be used to find and book the appropriate resources to the project or task.

To create a Project Assignment Profile, create a project plan, with associated tasks, then go to the Assignment profile tab on the project record, create a new assignment profile and add all skills required. You can then use the assignment profile to replace a generic resource with a qualified resource.



If the Automated Search Engine for Booking Creation optional feature is enabled for your account, you can also select the **Project assignment profile** appears on the following views:

- New multiple bookings form Click the Create button then click **New, multiple** under Bookings to access the form.
- Booking worksheet (classic and dynamic) Go to Resources > Bookings > Worksheet to access the worksheet.

Project Budget

Stay on top of your project finances with the Project Budget optional feature. The feature lets you set a budget for labor, expenses, and purchases, and track expenditure either at the project or task level.


- You can compare up to five submitted budgets side-by-side and approve the most realistic scenario. View totals as well as monthly, quarterly, category-level, and task-level details.
- You can keep different versions of the same budget.
- You can can submit multiple budgets for approval. Approving a budget automatically rejects the others and lets the submitter know which was approved.
- You can define your own color codes ranges to identify whether budget items are on or off target, based on the percentage of planned versus actual expenditure.

For more information about configuring and using the Project Budget feature, see Administrator Guide.



Important: The previously existing Project Budget feature has been renamed "Transactional Budget". You can change the account term for "Transactional Budget" in Administration > Global settings > Display > Interface: Terminology.

Project Center

The Project Center optional feature aims to provide you with the tools to manage key project activities from a single page.

The Project Center lets you:

- Create and modify your project plans See the help topic Managing Project Plans in the Project Center.
- Create and manage resource bookings from within the project center See the help topic Managing Resource Bookings in the Project Center.
- Track hours worked in past periods and view the planned resource costs and time charges Viewing Hours, Time Costs, or Time Charges in the Project Center


Account administrators control who can access the project center by role permission.

Account administrators control project center options for all account users, including whether the project center show project sequence information only or project sequence information and resource booking information. See the help topic Project Center Options.

To access the project center for a specific project, go to Projects > Projects > [Select a project] > Project Center.

The project center view looks similar to a list and supports several list features including inline-editing. A label above the column headers indicates whether the project center view is editable or read-only, depending on the access control settings for the project you are viewing and your permissions. For more information about inline-editing, see the help topic Inline-Editing in Lists.

Optional Features



Editable list view



Note: Depending on your role, you may not be able to edit all information in the project center view even if the view itself is editable.

Form permissions and form rules are applied. Form scripts associated with the booking form will be triggered when updating a booking record directly from the project center.

The project center includes the following components:

Toolbar — The project center toolbar includes the column selection and download tools available for lists throughout OpenAir as well as functionality specific to the project center view. See the help topic Project Center Toolbar.

Project outline — The project outline occupies only the left section of the canvas and shows your project sequence and, depending on the project center options configured for your account, resources booked to your project.

- You can create and modify your project plans.
- You can add phases, tasks and milestones to your project and modify the project sequence.
- You can view, enter or update information about the phases, tasks and milestones in your project using inlineediting.
- You can set task and phase dependencies.
- You can choose the columns shown in the project outline. The first time you visit the project center, the project outline includes the following columns: Actions, Task, Start, Finish, Hours — Booked. Only the Actions and Task columns are required, all others are optional. You can include columns corresponding to standard and custom fields for task records (phases, tasks and milestones) and booking records. You can save the layout in the same way as for lists. See the help topics Selecting List Columns and Personalized List Layouts.

- Add resource bookings at the task level or at the project level. You can change the resources booked directly from the project center view. (Available only if project center options are set to show resource booking information)
- View, enter, or update resource booking information using inline-editing. (Available only if project center options are set to show resource booking information)
- Add built-in and custom fields for the booking entity as columns to the project outline.

Relationship lines show a clear overview of the project structure and relationships between phases, tasks, bookings and milestones in the project. You can expand and collapse each node in the project tree to show or hide all phases, tasks, bookings, and milestones nested under that node.

The project schedule information (calculated task, phase and project **Start** dates and **Finish** dates, and **Planned** hours) is updated automatically when you make a relevant change in the project center. When the calculation is in progress, information in the Start, Finish and Planned hours columns cannot be edited and loading spinners are visible in the column headers. See the help topic Project Schedule Calculation in the Project Center.

Booking grid — The Project Center view shows a booking grid alongside the project outline. Depending on the selected granularity, the booking grid shows a week-by week or month-by-month schedule. Each column corresponds to a week or month and the column header shows the first day of the week or month. See the help topic Date Navigation in the Project Center. The number of columns in the grid depends on the size of your browser window. It is calculated automatically when you first load the page or when you refresh it.

- You can use the booking grid to enter the number of hours you want to book a resource for a given task (or at the project level) in a given week or month. You can copy multiple cell values using the copy and paste or fill handle functionality.
 - You can use the date navigation panel in the toolbar to change the period shown in the booking grid.
 - You can use the measure selector in the toolbar to switch between viewing hours, time costs or time charges in the booking grid. See the help topic Viewing Hours, Time Costs, or Time Charges in the Project Center.

Horizontal bars in the booking grid give a visual representation of the duration of the project, each phase and task based on the Start and Finish dates. Each bar is located at the top of the row and is color-coded: green color for the project, dark gray color for each phase, light gray color for each task.


Availability indicators show the availability of the resource for each week as you make changes, and warning indicators show out of schedule bookings and potential overutilization of resources.

Important: Review the following guidelines:

The booking grid is available only if project center options are set to show resource booking information – See the help topic Project Center Options.



- By default, the calculated task, phase and project Start dates and Finish dates, Planned hours and **% Complete** are calculated based on assignments and not on bookings. To base the calculation on bookings instead of assignments for a project, see the help topic Basing Project Schedule Calculation on Bookings for a Project.
- The project center does not currently support booking approvals You cannot submit bookings for approval, approve or reject bookings using the project center.



Optional Features



Note: The following list functionality is not available in the project center:

- Filtering and sorting options The project center page is designed to show the full project outline and all resource bookings in the project sequence.
- Rows per page You can collapse and expand nodes in the project trees to show or hide phase, task, booking and milestone rows nested under the node. This functionality would not be supported with a limited number of rows per page.
- Column lock The project center uses a fixed column lock to separate the project outline and the booking grid in the same view.
- Bulk actions Not currently supported.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support. The Project Center feature requires the Inline-Editing in Lists feature to be enabled.



Important: Test the project center feature extensively on a sandbox account or during release preview before you enable it on your production account.

- Note the following difference of behavior:
 - If you add a booking in the project center, a separate booking record is created for each week you book the resource.
 - If you create a booking using the entity properties form, you can create a single booking record for any length of time.


Project Status News Feed

Add, update, and display project status messages to keep project stakeholders informed.

When this feature is enabled:


- Project record headers and project QuickViews show a news feed icon ... Click this icon to open the project status news feed, where you can add status updates to your project or read existing updates.
- You can add the News feed Status column to your lists.
 - The News feed Status column shows the project status as a color coded text badge, if there are any status updates for the project and if a project status is set in the latest status update.
 - Click the status to open the project status news feed from the projects list and view the latest status update details. You can sort and filter your data by status using the list sort and filtering options.

Optional Features







Each status update shows a date and time stamp and the name of the person who created it.



By default, the news feed displays 5 status updates when opened. Click Load more to load additional messages.



You can scroll through the news feed when there are more status updates than the page can fit. Long status updates are not shown in full. Click **Read more** to see all the text.



Status updates can be edited. Edited status updates show the mention (Edited) in the upper right corner. Point to (Edited) to see when and by whom the status update was edited.



To close the project status news feed, click anywhere outside of it.

Account administrators can control who can view or modify the project status news feed using the following role permissions:

- View project news feed on any project Users with this role can see the project status news feed, but cannot edit it.
- View and modify project status news feed on any project Users with this role can see the project status news feed and add, edit, or delete messages in it.



Note: Project owners can add, view, modify or delete news feed messages for the projects they own even if they do not have this permission.

Restrict Project Recalculation to Tasks Impacted by the Changes on the Project Outline, Gantt and Task **Detail View**

Improve the performance of the project outline, Gantt and task detail view by restricting project recalculation to tasks that are impacted by the changes.

By default, when you create, duplicate, delete, or modify a task associated with the project you are viewing, or when you move or copy a task to another project, the project calculation includes all tasks associated with the project.

With this feature enabled, only the tasks that are impacted by the changes are include in the project calculation. For example, if you change the planned hours for a resource assigned to a particular task, the recalculation will include only the specific task and any successor tasks. None of the other tasks are included in the recalculation.

The optimization improves loading time for the following views after making changes or after running the project recalculation manually.

- Projects > [Select a project] > Phases/Tasks > List.
- Projects > [Select a project] > Phases/Tasks > Outline Create, delete, duplicate, copy, move, repeat
- Projects > [Select a project] > Phases/Tasks > Gantt Create, delete, duplicate, copy, move, repeat



Project Status Summaries (PSS)

Produce a project status page summarizing important project progress data. The Project Status Summary can be customized and populated with information critical to your company internally or your customers externally.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.



Each Project Status report can contain a header with basic information about the project. The default project header can be modified or deleted.

Below the header, you can add a series of portlets which show information about tasks, task assignments, bookings, and other project- and task-related information. The portlets can be moved, edited, and deleted in the PSS' "Edit" mode. The description of portlets can be edited, and individual portlets can be configured to be visible or hidden to customers.

Dynamic portlets such as the Bookings portlet also allow you to set primary, secondary, and tertiary sorting criteria or filters for the individual information cards which they display.

Project Status Summaries can be printed or converted to a PDF document.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support and ask them to enable the Project Status Summaries feature. After you enable this feature, you need to assign View or Edit permissions to your roles. The available role settings are:

- View Project status page
- View and modify Project status page

Select Different Currencies for Loaded Cost Overrides

You can accurately report on a project's profitability based on a user's loaded cost value in OpenAir. Because a user's cost value may vary based on the project or task being worked on, loaded cost overrides can be established at the project or task level. Currently, when overriding the cost at the project or task level, the currency of the cost value is driven by the project's currency. At times, it may be beneficial for the currency of the user's cost value override to be different than the project's currency.

OpenAir enables you to override the currency value for loaded cost overrides at the project and task levels. This permits more accurate profitability reporting based on the loaded cost currency on a perproject or per-task basis. The default setting for the currency value is set to "[Use Project Currency]" unless modified to a different selection. However, please note that if the project's currency changes, it does not dynamically update the currency value to the project's new currency.



This feature sets the landing page within each project, for example, on the Task List. It can be set at a User level or for your whole company.

Show Billing Rules on Revenue Recognition Forms

Link billing rules to revenue recognition rules.

This feature allows you to choose which revenue recognition rule forms display a billing rule pick list. When you select a billing rule from this field, the billing rule is linked to the revenue recognition rule. This setting does not affect when billing or revenue recognition rules are run. Billing Rule IDs on revenue recognition rules can be accessed using the XML or SOAP APIs.

Single Billing Cap Across Multiple Subprojects Within a Portfolio Project

This feature lets you use customer POs to apply a single billing cap across all subprojects or across selected subprojects in a portfolio project — You can use the customer PO total, specified either in hours or as a monetary amount, as the billing cap.

You can read or modify the cap by customerpo field in the project billing rule table using the XML API and SOAP API, and the cap_by_customerpo attribute is also listed in the Scripting Center SOAP Explorer.

The following conditions must be met to modify cap_by_customerpo:

- The project associated to the project billing rule is a portfolio project. .
- The project associated to the project billing rule is associated with at least one customer PO.
- The billing rule is associated with a customer PO.
- The billing rule type is one of the following: Expense item, Purchase item, Time.

Important: This feature requires the Portfolio Projects and Subprojects feature to be enabled for your account. See also Portfolio Projects and Subordinate Projects.

Using a Customer PO as a Billing Rule Cap

You can use customer POs to apply a single billing cap across all subprojects, or across selected subprojects in a portfolio project. You can use the customer PO total, specified either in hours or as a monetary amount, as the billing cap.



Note: Review the following guidelines:

- A customer PO can only be used as a billing rule cap for one portfolio project at any time.
- You can go to Projects > Projects > [Select a project] > Financials > Customer POs to view or modify Customer POs associated with the selected project.

To use a customer PO as a billing rule cap:

- 1. Go to Administration > Application Settings > Invoices > Customer POs to view the list of customer POs.
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - Select a customer PO.
 - Create a new customer PO To do so, click the Create button, then New > Customer PO.

- 5. Go to Projects > Projects > [Select a portfolio project] > Properties.
- 6. Under the General section of the project properties form, next to Customer POs, click Create or **Edit** and make sure the relevant Customer PO is selected.
- 7. Go to Financials > Billing > Rules.
- 8. Do one of the following:
 - Select an existing Time, Expense item, or Purchase item billing rule.
 - Click the Create button and Time billing rule, Expense item billing rule, or Purchase item billing rule.

- 9. Under the Other section of the billing rule form, select a **Customer PO**.
- 10. Under the Rule cap section of the billing rule form:
 - Check the Use customer PO cap box. The Cap (money) or Cap (hours) will be populated automatically using the Customer PO Amount (money) or Amount (hours) value when you save the form.
 - Optional) Check the **Adjust ... to fit under the cap** box.
 - Optional) Check the **Do not bill ... that exceed the cap** box.
- 11. Click Save.

Task on Purchase Requests

This feature lets you select a project task on purchase request or purchase item records. When enabled, the Task column can be added to purchase request and purchase item lists and detailed reports.

User-Level Outline View

The User-Level Outline View feature enabled adds details about assignments in the Outline and Gantt view:

- A row is added for each resources assigned to the task under each task instead of a summary of resources assigned in the **Assigned to** column.

View Tasks for Inactive Projects in Task List

Managers often leverage the project task list to manage tasks. At times, there may be a need to view information for tasks that are associated with an inactive project. Without this feature, only tasks associated with active projects are displayed in the task list. When this feature is enabled, a new column is added to the task list to allow users to filter on tasks associated with an active or inactive project. To add

the project status, users with the appropriate role privileges go to Projects > Tasks > Pending/Completed/ All tasks and click on the **Customize list** link on the upper left corner of the top menu bar. Click **Project** active and select Add selected items. Click OK.



Advanced Booking Worksheet

Use a more streamlined, detailed, and visually-appealing worksheet to create and manage your bookings.



A new and improved version of the Resource Booking Worksheet is now available to help you create and manage bookings more efficiently than ever. The new Worksheet has the following features:

- Bookings appear under each resource.
- See resource utilization at a glance. Green, yellow, and red color-coded cells highlight underutilized, fully utilized, and overutilized resources.
- Point to a resource's name to open a resource QuickView.
- Display and edit booking information in daily, weekly, monthly, or many other more time periods.
- Drill down to greater levels of detail.
- Filter the worksheet by department, job code, project, or skills.
- Column and row totals showing total number of hours or percentages across all visible resources and all visible time periods.

Resource utilization subtotals showing total number of hours or percentages for both the filtered set and all resource bookings when filters are applied.

The Advanced Booking Worksheet requires the Resource Planner feature, and also requires the following role permissions for roles which will use the worksheet:

- View and modify bookings
- View resource planner

Auto-Create Bookings for Generic Resources

This feature lets you create a baseline of bookings for generic resources before resources have been committed to it. This feature will create bookings for each generic assigned to a project, using a button on the outline view. The feature can only be enabled if 'Enable approvals for bookings' is enabled.

Switch is 'Enable creation of bookings for generics from project plan.' Role permission is 'Create bookings' for generics from project plan'. A user does not need to have the ability to otherwise view/modify/ create bookings, or even have access to the Resources module to use this, so long as they have the role permission.



Consolidated Resource Profiles

Get clear and complete details on each of your resources.

Use consolidated resource profiles to see what skills and experience your resources have at a glance. You can use it to update your resources' skills, which in turn helps you to assign the right resource to the right task and keeping them engaged, motivated, and increasing revenue.

The consolidated resource profile contains a header, which you can customize with information such as the resource's email address, manager, location, or any user custom field arranged in four columns. There is no limit to the number of fields which can be shown in the header.

Below the header is a table of the resource's skills and experience. Click each skill to see descriptions of each skill level.


- **Note:** Resources with the "View my own profile" role permission can see their information but cannot edit their demographics or custom fields. Resources with the "View and modify my own profile" role permission can also update their skills and experiences, but not the demographics. Users with either role will see a "My profile" link in the User Menu which opens the Consolidated Resource Profile.
- Warning: Users will not be able to see information hidden by a switch or role permission, (for example, "Cost" or "Rate"). These fields will instead display an empty field. Custom fields and their data are always visible. Do not add custom fields to the Resource Profile which should remain hidden from some users.

Customized User Avatars


Give your resource profiles personality with custom user avatars or profile pictures.

When this feature is enabled:

 Users can upload their own profile pictures to replace the generic resource icon in their resource profile. The picture can be resized and repositioned to get your avatar right.



- The top bar shows the user's profile picture, if this user has one. Otherwise, it shows the user's initials on a blue color background or
 - **Note:** If you proxy in as (sign in and perform tasks on behalf of) another user, the top bar shows the initials of that user on a red color background, even if the user has a profile picture.
- The resource compare view shows the profile picture for the resource if one exists.



This feature currently supports BMP, GIF, PNG, and JPG images, and the image file size cannot be larger than 1 MB. Uploaded avatar images do not count against your account storage.

(i) Note: To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support and request the Customized User Avatars feature. If this feature has been enabled and later disabled, all uploaded avatar images are deleted. This feature also creates two role permissions which can be assigned to users: Modify own Profile picture allows users to modify their own profile picture. Modify all Profile pictures allows a user to modify all pictures for all users they have access to. The consolidated resource profiles feature must also be enabled to show custom profile pictures on the user interface — see Consolidated Resource Profiles.

Decouple RDR Header and RRQ Booking Type

Without this feature enabled, the RDR header booking type and its RRQs are connected. Whenever either of these are changed it changes all booking types in the queue for that header and inversely.

This feature breaks the connection allowing RDR booking types and RRQ booking types to be changed independently.

Detailed Booking Groupings in the Advanced **Booking Worksheet**

The Advanced Booking Worksheet rows uses both visible and hidden columns to group bookings under worksheet rows.

This optional feature includes the following functionality:


- All the bookings grouped under a single worksheet row have the same values for all fields except the note, start date and end date fields. Bookings grouped under the same worksheet row not only have the same values in the columns that are visible in the Advanced Booking Worksheet but also have the same value in the columns which are not shown.
 - **Note:** When the feature is not enabled, bookings grouped under the same worksheet row have the same values in the visible worksheet columns but may have different values in the hidden columns.
- The Bookings column shows an information icon next to the number of bookings when both the following conditions apply:
 - □ Two or more worksheet rows show the same information in the visible columns.
 - Some of the booking information is unique to each worksheet row.



To show the details for the bookings grouped under a single row, click the link showing the number of bookings in the Bookings column. A popup window shows detailed information for the bookings and the list of bookings sharing this information.

If two or more worksheet rows share some information:

- The shared information is displayed under the **Bookings information** heading.
- The information that is unique to the bookings grouped under the worksheet row is displayed under the **Unique information** heading.



The improved copy functionality copies all fields from the existing booking except the start date, end date, requester and note fields.

Disable New, Multiple Bookings Option

This feature removes the Bookings "New, multiple..." option from the Create Button menu.

Display More Bookings in Advanced Booking Worksheet

Load up to 2,000 bookings at a time.

By default, the Advanced Booking Worksheet loads up to 500 bookings when opened. With this feature, the number of bookings which are loaded can be changed to 1,000 bookings, 1,500 bookings, or 2,000 bookings.



Note: Increasing the number of bookings which are displayed in the Advanced Booking Worksheet may impact performance.

To load more bookings in the Advanced Booking Worksheet when opened, contact OpenAir Customer Support and ask them to set the desired number of bookings to display in the Advanced Booking Worksheet.

Enable a Booking Type to Exist in All Approval Statuses

This feature eliminates the association of a booking type to the approval stages for bookings. When moving from one approval status to the next, the booking type defaults are no longer required to be configured. Any booking type can be associated with any stage.

Enable Bookings to be Auto-Approved

This feature permits the [Submitter] metavalue to be selected for user and project booking approvals. Bookings are then approved automatically after they are submitted.

Set whether approving a booking request automatically creates a booking or not. When approving booking requests, you can now check a box to approve a booking request but not create bookings.

Resource Demand Request


The Resource Demand Request feature can be used to find and book resources. Define the skills required, search and select resources selection based on several indicators (for example, skills match, utilization %), then issue standard bookings for the selected resources.

The Resource Demand Request feature handles booking in a robust way, providing a more transparent overview of the booking progress at each step of its lifetime.

If the Enable a Booking Type to Exist in All Approval Statuses optional feature is also enabled, users with the "Allow change of booking type on finalized resource request" role permission can edit the booking type field on a resource demand request even after the request is finalized and submitted to a resource manager. Resource Demand Request Queues Cannot be Finalized If Availability is Zero

With this feature, Resource Demand Request Queues can no longer be finalized if the availability hours or percentage is set to 0.

Resource Planner

The resource booking planner provides a global view on bookings by calendar and resource utilization calculated per day, week or month. It is the perfect tool to spot under or over utilization and to quickly resolve it.

Simply drag and drop to quickly reassign a booking from one resource to another. Drag a box over the required date period next to an existing booking and a new booking will be created, with values sourced from the original booking and the selected date range. Open the Edit Booking form by clicking the **Edit this booking** icon or use the **More options** icon to create, edit, duplicate or delete bookings directly from the resource planner. Overbooked resources are highlighted in the customer view. When a booking is changed the utilization bar is changed to "Unknown". The new utilization is calculated when the booking is saved. All bookings for one resource can be rolled up to one line to use less space if there are no overlapping bookings. Two new options are made available on the booking planner settings to give the visibility of resources which are inactive or with no bookings for the specified period.




Note: If the Resource Booking Approvals feature is enabled for your account, depending on your company's OpenAir account configuration, bookings with the approval status "Submitted" or "Approved" cannot be modified. You cannot drag to change the start date, end date, duration or resource booked from the Resource Booking Planner view.

In the redesigned resource booking planner, the **Refresh** button and the **Legend** have been relocated to the toolbar. This increases the screen real estate for data on the resource booking planner grid and chart.

With this feature enabled, overbooked resources are highlighted in the customer view. Click the arrow on the left to get to the resource view and analyze why the overutilization has occurred.




Resource Profile Type Access Control

This feature lets you control access to resource profile types by role. When this feature is enable you can:

- Check the **Restricted** box for a resource profile in Administration > Application Settings > Resources > Resource profiles to restrict access to these resource profiles.
 - Users must have specific role permissions to view, to select or to modify restricted resource profile types anywhere in OpenAir.
- Assign the following role permissions to specific roles:
 - View restricted profiles Users with this role permission can see and select restricted resource profile types, but cannot edit them.
 - View and modify restricted profiles Users with this role permission can see, select and edit restricted resource profile types.

Restrict Utilization Recalculation to Resources Impacted by the Changes on the Advanced Booking Worksheet


Improve the performance of the advanced booking worksheet by restricting utilization recalculation to resources that are impacted by the changes.

By default, when you add, modify, or delete bookings using the advanced booking worksheet, the utilization is recalculated for all shown resources.

With this feature enabled, the utilization is recalculated only for the resources that are impacted by these changes. When you save the advanced booking worksheet, a label appears next to each impacted resource:

- A Pending calculation badge indicates that the calculation is in progress. The worksheet may not show the latest booking and utilization information for this resource. Wait for the calculation to complete then reload the page.
- A **Ready** badge indicates that the calculation is completed. To view the latest booking and utilization information for this resource, reload the page.
- A Changed badge indicates that changes have been made by another user impacting the information you are viewing. To view the latest booking and utilization information for this resource, reload the page.

Show Project Assignment Profiles on Task Assignments

This feature ensures that assignment profile values on a task's assignments always remain visible in the user interface and related reports.

Visibility includes on the Task Assignment section of the Create/Edit task form, project outline view, and as a task detail field on reports.

Skills Approvals

Get control over your resources' skills. With this feature, you can delegate the responsibility of keeping your resources' profiles up-to-date. OpenAir notifies you when your resources update their skills in the Resource Profile. With your approval, the skills are updated.



Resources with either of the following role permissions can edit their own skills and experience in their profile:

- View and modify own resource profile
- View and modify profiles

When one of your resources makes a change to their resource profile and clicks Save & Submit, the change is marked with a "Pending" badge in their profile.

You will also receive a notification that your resource has made a change to their resource profile. You can set these notifications in Administration > Application Settings > Resources > Notifications. After you set them up, email notifications will be sent as with other types of approvals when changes are submitted. Reminders will also appear on the Dashboard.

Use Booking Request Grid to Enter Multiple Requests That Are Available

Similar to the resource booking grid, a booking request grid has been added to Resources to help save time and offer increased flexibility. Using the grid, create multiple booking requests that vary in booking amounts and save and submit them from the grid. A resource can be booked for different hour or percentage amounts during a project. Custom fields can also be added to the grid to tailor the information captured to unique company needs.

View Advanced Resource Search Role Permission

Control who can access the Advanced Resource Search feature using the View Advanced Resource **Search** role permission.



If you use OpenAir to send invoices to customers, different invoice layouts can be configured to modify the appearance of an invoice based on customer needs. Invoice layouts can be assigned at the customer, project or invoice level. In addition to being able to sort or group items, the terminology for certain fields can be overridden and applied to that specific invoice layout. It is also possible to override the terminology for "Agreement" and "Customer PO". This feature adds overriding the terminology for "Customer PO Number".




Advanced Agreement and Customer PO Balance Calculation

The agreement and customer PO functionality permits companies to track what's been billed against an agreed upon amount with their customer. For example, if a customer agrees to a \$10,000 contract for a project, an agreement or customer PO can be created for the \$10,000. As work is being performed and charges are generated by billing, the contract amount can then be drawn down based on charge amounts. As the project progresses, it is beneficial to see the remaining balance on the contract to ensure that the project is still on track.

Advanced balance calculations are available for agreements and customer POs. With this advanced calculation, users have the ability to configure charge stages indicating when charges should be deducted from the agreement or customer PO balance. Within a charge stage, users can choose to have the balance deducted for all charges, charges placed on an invoice, charges not on an invoice, or no charges. The agreement or customer PO balance will deduct the charge amount from the balance based on the rule selection on the charge stage. For example, if the rule for the "Write-Off" charge stage is set such that no charges placed in that charge stage should be deducted, any charge placed in that charge stage will never be deducted from the balance.




Allow an Approver to Edit a Submitted Invoice

Companies often require their users to submit invoices for approval by the finance department or management. To ensure the billing process is not delayed, it is beneficial for the approver to be able to make modifications to the invoice or associated charges. Previously, to make changes to the invoice, it needed to be rejected.

When this feature is enabled, to edit a submitted invoices, approvers go to Invoices > Invoices > Submitted and select an invoice. To edit the invoice header information, click on the "Edit" or "Properties" link. Edit the form and click Save. To edit the associated charges, click on the "Change charges" or "Charges" link. Edit or remove individual charges.


Credit and Rebill Functionality for Invoices

The invoicing functionality lets you group multiple charges that should be billed and sent to a customer. Invoices can be sent through an approval process, sent to a customer and subsequently exported to an external accounting system. At times it is necessary to credit and potentially rebill an invoice that has already been approved, sent to a customer, or has been exported. By default, if an invoice and corresponding charges have been approved or exported, a credit would need to be applied manually creating negative offsetting charges. New charges would also need to be created manually if the invoice needed to be rebilled.

The Credit and Rebill feature streamlines the process of crediting an invoice and rebilling associated charges after a credit has been issued. After you enable this feature, Go to the Credit/Rebill tab on the invoice record to credit, or credit and rebill an invoice. If you credit an invoice, a new invoice will be created that contains offsetting charges of the original invoice. If you then rebill the invoice, the charges from the original invoice will be available to be placed on a new invoice. Both credit and rebill invoices will go through the same approval process as the original invoice. Additionally, the History link in the original invoice will indicate whether the invoice has been credited or rebilled, with the corresponding invoice numbers.

You can enter the invoice date when you create the credit invoice. Account administrators can set the **Invoice credit date** as either the date from the original invoice or today's date (default). This date is visible on credit invoices, and can be edited until the credit invoice is approved. To set the Credit Invoice Date, go to Administration > Application Settings > Invoices > Other settings.



Display a Zero Sum Tax Rate and Amount on Invoices

If you use OpenAir to send invoices, multiple invoice layouts can be configured to enhance the appearance of the invoice. For various reasons, it may be necessary to display the total tax amount, even if the tax amount is zero.


You can enter a zero percentage for the tax rate if you use tax locations. When a percentage for a tax location is entered as a blank or zero value, the percentage rate will be saved as 0%.

Enhanced Workflow Process Invoice Submission and Revenue Container Creation

This feature enhances the workflow process for invoice submission and revenue container creation. When billing has been run and an invoice has been created, a new link is now available on the invoice page to submit the invoice, run revenue recognition on the project, and create a revenue container in one single click. When all actions have been performed, you are redirected to the Balance Summary page of the new revenue container. OpenAir performs appropriate checks to ensure that the project meets all the criteria for a new revenue container.



Note: If there is an existing revenue container that has not yet been approved, an error message appears indicating that an open or submitted revenue container still exists and therefore OpenAir cannot automatically submit the invoice and create the revenue container. A link in the error message points to the existing revenue container that needs to be approved.



Generate Charges for Partial Periods

This feature permits a user to generate charges for incomplete periods. For example, a user wants to charge a customer \$1000 a month on the 1st of each month. But a one month contract was signed on the 15th which means that the customer needs to be charged \$500 for the current month and \$500 for the next month.

This feature is used to create fractional charges for incomplete periods.



This feature works for:

- Project > Financials > Billing Rules (fixed fee on date or milestone)
- Project > Financials > Revenue Recognition Rules (fixed amount on date or milestone rule)



Important: This feature is not designed to work with the repeat for X number of instances option.



Negative Charge Stages

There is a new option available from Administration > Application Settings > Invoices > Charge stages > [select Charge stage] > [Options].

Charge stages can be consider as 'Regular' or 'Negative' based on the setting of the All charges within this stage to be multiplied by -1 checkbox:

- **Negative Stage** All charges within this stage to be multiplied by -1 is checked.
- Regular Stage All charges within this stage to be multiplied by -1 is NOT checked.



When a charge is moved from a Regular Stage to a Negative Stage (and inversely) the charge is multiplied by -1. The charge is not changed if it is moved between two stages of the same type.






Prevent Invoicing and Revenue Recognition Per Customer PO and Agreement

Often, companies plan Customer POs and Agreements and have users begin work before they are signed. In addition to having users log time and expenses, accurate billing and revenue forecasting is necessary for these cases. However, since these are considered to be part of at risk projects, invoicing, revenue recognition transaction, and revenue container creation should be prohibited.

You can designate specific Customer POs and Agreements that should prevent invoicing and revenue recognition creation. If a Customer PO / Agreement has the option enabled, users will not be able to use the associated charges in invoices, revenue recognition transactions or revenue containers for that Customer PO / Agreement until that option has been disabled. However, billing rules, revenue recognition rules, charge and revenue projections, project billing transactions, and charges can be created for the project.



Pro-Rate Selected Charges

This feature lets you select one or more charges and then pro-rate the charges total.

You enter one of the value fields and the other two are then automatically calculated. For example, if the Total selected is \$1,600.00 and 80% is entered into Retain % then Retain total is assigned 1280 and Move remaining is assigned 320.



You can move the remaining total to a specific charge stage.

Save Invoices Short URL

This optional feature adds the custom field **Online Invoice** [openair invoice short url] to the Invoice entity. The custom field is used to store the invoice URL that OpenAir generates automatically when an invoice is created. It is read-only and appears on the invoice properties form as a hyperlink.

Administrators can control who can view the **Online Invoice** link on the invoice properties form using form permissions.



Tip: All users will be able to see the Online Invoice link by default. Make sure you set the relevant form permissions after you enable this feature if access needs to be restricted.

The **Online Invoice** custom field supports read requests using the XML API, SOAP API and User Scripting.



(i) Note: The invoice URL is the short URL included in the body of the invoice email when you go to the Send tab for a given invoice record in OpenAir.

Save Payment Terms Internal ID on Invoice Records

Depending on your account configuration, you can select the payment terms on the invoice entity property form using a dropdown list. By default, the payment terms name is saved on the invoice record but not the payment terms ID.

This optional feature sets the internal ID of the payment terms selected for the invoice automatically when you create a new invoice or update an existing record. If your account is configured to show internal IDs on lists or on reports and if you are an account administrator or have the relevant role permissions, you can add the Internal ID - payment_terms_id column on lists or the Internal ID payment terms id attribute to Invoice detail reports.

With this feature enabled, the payment_termsid value can be retrieved and modified using the XML or SOAP API.

Note: If the payment terms field currently shows as a text field on the invoice property form, it will show as a dropdown list after you enable this feature. The payment terms internal ID will not be populated for existing invoice records when you enable this feature. To set the payment terms internal ID for existing records, you can either save existing invoices manually or use the XML or SOAP API.

Subtotal and Sort Expense Item Groups on **Invoices**

These features allow you to change the sorting and subtotal appearance in invoices.

Sort all expense items alphabetically — when selected, all expense items are sorted alphabetically. If cleared, the order in which these expenses groups were created is preserved.

- Display subtotals for custom expense item groups when using alternate invoice layout for **expense charges** — Select this option to display subtotals for custom expense item groups on invoices.
- **(i) Note:** These features are only supported when the invoice layout uses custom groupings and an alternate layout for expenses.

To change these settings, go to Administration > Application Settings > Invoices > Invoice layouts > [select a layout] and go to the "Combine charges" section of the form.




Exclude Specific Values from Filters in Reports

OpenAir reporting permits great flexibility in providing key information to users and managers. In addition to selecting a multitude of reporting values, users can configure filters within a report to limit the items that need to be included in the report. For example, if running a utilization report, managers may choose to only report on the utilization value for full-time employees. To do this, users would click on the Resource filter on the report edit form and include the individual users that should be displayed in the report results. For some companies, there may be a larger number of full-time employees than part-time employees and therefore managers may want to exclude the part-time employees from the report rather than include all full-time employees.

Furthermore, new full-time employees may continue to be hired. This feature adds the ability for users to select an option to exclude values from specific filters in a report. In the aforementioned example, a user may want to exclude part-time employees. Thus, all existing and newly hired full-time employees will automatically be included in the report results.

Hide Personal User Data and Hours Remaining in the Timesheet Report

Keep personal user data safe with a new feature which hides this data in the timesheet report.

Report on More than 31 Days When Reporting on Daily Time Periods

Report Throttling

Stricter Permission Control for Extended Fields Derived from Employee Cost Information

Extend standard access control for extended fields and custom calculations derived from employee cost information.

By default, the access control rules for the operands used in a custom calculation apply to the custom calculation. A user can view custom calculations and other extended fields only if this user can view the standard fields, custom fields and extended fields used as operands in the extended field. Until now, the standard access control behavior did not apply to the following standard calculated fields derived from employee cost information. This feature extends standard access control so that users can only see the following fields and custom calculations using any of these fields as operands if their role allows them to view the relevant employee cost information.

Projects – Projected cost [rules]

- Projects Projected cost of unbillable hours [rules]
- Projects Projected billing margin [rules]
- Projects Projected billing [rules]

The following role permissions are supported:

- View all user costs
- View primary loaded cost
- View secondary loaded cost
- View tertiary loaded cost
- View and modify user cost



Note: This extended access control currently does not apply to renamed built-in summary fields based on any of the extended field listed above, and any custom calculations using these renamed built-in summary fields.

The Stricter Permission Control for Extended Fields Derived from Employee Cost Information feature is enabled by default. To disable the feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Web Services Log Details Report

This feature adds the ability to include web service requests and responses within the application. This will help troubleshoot any API requests that fail.



Important: The Web services log report feature has the following limitations:

- If you do not use this feature for more than 30 days, the feature is disabled and the log entries are deleted.
- Log entries are retained for 7 days only, then they are purged from the database.

You can use our REST API, SOAP API and XML API to integrate your professional services data with your enterprise data. See the help topic API Overview.

OpenAir API supports OAuth 2.0, a robust authorization framework. This authorization framework enables client applications to use a token to access OpenAir through the API. The application accesses the protected resources on behalf of a user who gave an explicit permission for the access. This method eliminates the need for API integrations to store user credentials.

Before you begin using these services, review the best practice guidelines. See the help topics Security Considerations for Developers and API Best Practice Guidelines.

REST API

OpenAir REST API provides an interface for integration applications to exchange information with OpenAir.

The REST API:

- Is organized around REST.
- Uses predictable resource-oriented URLs.
- Accepts JSON-encoded request bodies.
- Returns JSON-encoded responses.
- Uses standard HTTP response codes, authentication and verbs.

The REST API lets you:


- Use CRUD (create, read, update, delete) operations on OpenAir records.
- Retrieve a list of records from a collections and use pagination.

Filter OpenAir record collections.

The REST API is a service layer that is built on top of the business layer in OpenAir. This ensures that business rules configured for your OpenAir account are applied when an integration application interacts with your OpenAir data through the REST API. Business rules include OpenAir account configuration settings and access control mechanisms, as well as any user scripts deployed on your from the company's OpenAir account.

The REST API supports OAuth 2.0 exclusively for authentication and authorization, which is a more robust and reliable way to access data.

If the REST API is enabled for your account, account administrators and employees with the Export data role permission can access the REST API definition in OpenAPI 3.0 JSON format. The generated documentation includes a full REST API reference including resource descriptions, endpoints and methods, parameters, request body and response examples and schema.

Note: API Access must be enabled for your account before you can enable the REST API. To obtain API Access, contact your OpenAir account manager.



Important: The REST API was introduced in the October 10, 2020 OpenAir release. It is an initial version with limited functionality.

Some optional features and application settings may not be fully supported.

As with any other API or platform features, it is crucial that you test integration applications leveraging the REST API extensively on a Sandbox account. Make sure your integration applications run smoothly without error on a non-production account before you implement it on your production account.

Script Support for Web Service API Methods

This feature allows you to access NSOA.wsapi functions for user scripting.





Script Support for HTTPS Methods

This feature allows you to access NSOA.https functions for user scripting.

Integrate OpenAir with other online applications using outbound calls.

This feature allows you to access NSOA.https functions for user scripting and to run workflow processes automatically from OpenAir across to other APIs, using form or scheduled scripts.



The feature includes:

- Five new NSOA functions supporting the HTTPS GET, POST, PUT, PATCH and DELETE request methods to read, send, update and delete data from/to external APIs.
- A new Password script parameter, allowing you to store encrypted credentials and use them in your scripts for secure deployment and maintenance.

Possible use cases include integration with Jira for agile development, Slack for team collaboration, Office 365 for notifications, or other external or bespoke APIs in your environment.





Loaded Cost Custom Import

This feature enables you to create a custom import workflows to import information from a NetSuite custom record type into OpenAir as loaded cost [loaded_cost] records.

OpenAir lets you create custom workflows to import data from NetSuite service items or custom record types into a supported record type in OpenAir using your own field mapping definitions. You can use a custom import workflow to import employee loaded cost information from a NetSuite custom record type into OpenAir as loaded cost records. For more information about Custom import workflows, see the help topic Custom Import Workflows.

When you create a custom import workflow, you need to specify a custom field associated with the OpenAir record. OpenAir uses this custom field to store the internal ID of the corresponding NetSuite record. It is not possible to create custom fields for loaded cost records in OpenAir.

Enabling the Loaded Cost Custom Import optional feature creates a custom field associated with the Loaded Cost record type [loaded cost table]. The custom field name is netsuite loaded cost id.

After you enable the Loaded Cost Custom Import feature, you can create a custom import workflow to import loaded cost information into OpenAir from a custom record type in NetSuite. See the help topic Importing Records from NetSuite into OpenAir Using Custom Workflows.

When creating the custom import workflow, use the following settings:

NetSuite record – Select [Custom Record], and select the NetSuite custom record type holding employee loaded cost information from the **Specify** dropdown.



Tip: Click Synchronize to update the list of NetSuite custom record types without leaving the custom import workflow configuration form.

- **OpenAir record** Select Loaded cost.
- ID field Select netsuite_loaded_cost_id__c

Note: Employee loaded cost information must be sourced from a custom record type in NetSuite. If loaded cost information is entered on the employee record in NetSuite, for example, additional customization is required to copy this information automatically to the relevant custom records so that it can be imported into OpenAir. For more information about creating custom record types in NetSuite, see Creating Custom Record Types (External link to NetSuite SuiteAnswers | Answer ID: 10140).

The netsuite_loaded_cost_id custom field is not visible on the OpenAir UI.

- To view the NetSuite internal ID for an imported loaded cost record, export the loaded cost table using the Import/Export functionality in OpenAir. For more information about the Import/ Export functionality, see <a> Administrator Guide.
- To set the NetSuite internal ID for an existing loaded cost record, you need to use the OpenAir XML API, OpenAir SOAP API, or OpenAir Integration Manager. As with all import workflows, if you have existing loaded cost records in OpenAir, you should ensure that loaded cost custom imports do not create duplicate entries in OpenAir. Setting the NetSuite internal ID for existing records is one way of doing so.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Multithreading Support for On-Demand and Real-Time Export

Control how many threads the NetSuite Connector uses for integrations with SuiteCloud Plus.

If you have an active NetSuite SuiteCloud Plus license, you can enable multithreading support for ondemand and real-time export. You can request the maximum number of threads you want to allocate for the NetSuite integration.

- The value is set to 10 concurrent threads by default.
- You can request any maximum number of threads between 1 and 10.

After this feature is enabled, NetSuite Connector uses any available threads concurrently for the realtime export of records from OpenAir to NetSuite.

To enable multithreading support for on-demand and real-time export, contact OpenAir Customer Support.



Note: You can also control the number of threads used to export records as part of the main integration. For more information, see Multithreading Support for the Main Integration.



Important: To enable multithreading support, you must have an active NetSuite SuiteCloud Plus license. NetSuite SuiteCloud Plus allows up to 10 threads to be allocated concurrently for communication with NetSuite web services.

If you do not have an active NetSuite SuiteCloud Plus, the NetSuite integration is limited to a single thread communication with NetSuite web services at all time.

Multithreading Support for the Main Integration

Increase throughput by enabling the main integration to use multiple threads concurrently.

The NetSuite integration can use multiple threads to export records from OpenAir to NetSuite as part of main integration runs.

To enable multithreading support for the main integration, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

- Up to 10 threads can be allocated for main integration runs.
- Multithreading is supported only for export from OpenAir to NetSuite and not for import from NetSuite to OpenAir.

To enable multithreading support for the main integration, contact OpenAir Customer Support.



Important: To enable multithreading support, you must have an active NetSuite SuiteCloud Plus license. NetSuite SuiteCloud Plus allows up to 10 threads to be allocated concurrently for communication with NetSuite web services.

If you do not have an active NetSuite SuiteCloud Plus, the NetSuite integration is limited to a single thread communication with NetSuite web services at all time.

NetSuite Connector Administration Form Editor Permission

Account administrators with the relevant privilege can now save changes to the NetSuite Connector administration form without a password.

To let an account administrator edit settings on the NetSuite Connector administration form:

- 1. Contact OpenAir Customer Support and request the NetSuite Connector Administration Form Editor Permission optional feature.
- 2. In OpenAir, go to Administration > Global settings > Users > Employees > [Select an employee] > Demographic.
- 3. Check the View and edit NetSuite Connector administration form box under the Optional features section. This employee demographic setting is not available if the employee is not an administrator, even if the employee has the "View and edit integration settings" role permission.

4. Click Save.

By default, the Save button is disabled if there are any active scheduled or real-time integrations configured for your account. To make changes to the NetSuite Connector Administration form, first deactivate all scheduled and real-time integrations. To keep the Save button enabled at all time for authorized account administrators, check the "Do not prevent save on the NetSuite Connector administration form" box.



Important: Make sure you read the documentation and consider changes carefully before you save the NetSuite Connector administration form. The integration may stop working, or may not work as expected and cause data corruption if configured incorrectly.

NetSuite Connector Settings History

View the history of integration configuration changes using the NetSuite Connector Settings History page.

To view the NetSuite Connector Settings History page, go to Administration > NetSuite Connector, click the Tips menu, then **View history settings**.

The history settings page opens in a new browser tab or window. It uses the redesigned user experience list layout and features. The list shows audit trail information transformed for better readability.




(i) **Note:** A simple change can create multiple rows in the settings history. For example, adding a workflow to the list of workflows also adds rows changes for all the mapping groups and mapping definition rows created when adding this workflow.

The audit trail information shown on the NetSuite Connector Settings History is not yet fully optimized for readability and will be refined in a future release. For more information about reading the settings history list, see <a> NetSuite Integration.

The list can include the following columns

- Name of the **Employee** who made the change.
- Name of the Proxy Employee The name of the employee who made the change while signed in by proxy as the **Employee**.
- Section of the NetSuite Connector UI where the changes was made The different sections correspond to the different tab on the New NetSuite Connector UI (Credentials, Automate, Real-time, Mapping), to a specific feature (Workflow group and Workflow group assignment), or to the NetSuite Connector administration and workflow settings forms(NetSuite Connector Administration).
- Category of the setting changed Settings are grouped into categories that give additional information to help identify what was changed.
- The values in the Tab column shows the integration workflow and mapping group impacted by changes made to field mapping definitions.
- Internal ID of the Setting changed.
- Description of the Setting changed Additional information to help identify what was changed.
- Action performed Values include: Created, Updated, Deleted.
- Date the change was made.
- Original value before the change.
- New value after the change.
- Change made via How the change was made. For example, the change could be made using the NetSuite Connector UI, by importing settings from a file.

Prevent Saving NetSuite Connector Administration Form if Workflows are Scheduled or Set for Real-Time Integration

This optional feature disables the Save button on the NetSuite Connector administration form if there are any active scheduled or real-time integrations configured for your account. This forces authorized account administrators to deactivate all scheduled and real-time integrations before they can make any changes to the NetSuite Connector administration form.

This feature provides additional protection on top of other form validation in place to avoid common errors when editing the NetSuite Connector administration settings.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Workspaces

The following Workspaces Security features are available in OpenAir.

- Documents Bulk Deletion on Download
- Download All Documents Across All WorkSpaces

Documents Bulk Deletion on Download

This feature lets account administrators and users with the relevant role permission delete all documents from a workspace at the same time.

Account administrators control who can access that page using the following role permissions: Download all documents and Delete all documents.

To delete all documents in a workspace:

- 1. Go to Workspaces > [Select a workspace].
- Click Download all documents.
 - The Download all documents form appears
- 3. Check the **Delete all documents** box to delete the documents from OpenAir after downloading

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Download All Documents Across All WorkSpaces

This feature lets account administrators and users with the relevant role permission download all documents across all workspaces from Administration > Application Settings > Workspaces > Download all documents.

Account administrators control who can access that page using the following role permission: Download all documents in all workspaces.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Security

The following optional Security features are available in OpenAir.

- IP Restriction
- Password Security Questions
- Password Validation Against Known Compromised Passwords
- PI Removal

IP Restriction

Specify which IP addresses are authorized to access your company's OpenAir account. This includes access to your company's OpenAir account using the OpenAir UI, the OpenAir API, or any client application utilizing the API to exchange information with your company's OpenAir account.

This optional feature lets you store authorized IP addresses on the employee record for each user. You can allow single IP addresses or network ranges, using an explicit range or subnet mask. The IP Restriction feature may be used to ensure users can only access your company's OpenAir account if they are connected to your company's physical network or VPN, for example.

Feature Extensions

 IP Restriction Check for IP Change — You can extend the IP Restriction feature to check for IP address changes with every API request. In this case, if the IP address of the authenticated user's device changes and the new IP address is not in the IP address allowlist for this user, API requests return an error, and client applications utilizing the API can no longer exchange information with your company's OpenAir account. If the client applications utilizes the OAuth 2.0 authorization framework to connect to OpenAir, the OAuth 2.0 access and refresh tokens become invalid.

If the IP address of the authenticated user's device changes and the new IP address is not in the IP address allowlist for this user, the user can continue using the OpenAir UI normally until the user signs out or the session times out. This is true whether the user is accessing the OpenAir UI as a standalone application, or within NetSuite using the Single Sign-On integration feature.

- (i) **Note:** Client applications utilizing OpenAir API include:
 - OpenAir Mobile.
 - Other add-on services supplied by OpenAir (Integration Manager, Exchange Integration Manager, Projects Connector, Outlook Connector, OffLine).
 - Any bespoke integration utilizing the REST API, SOAP API, or XML API.

To enable this feature the IP Restriction or the IP Restriction Check for IP Change, contact OpenAir Customer Support. Additional setup is required for the IP restriction feature — for more information, see Security.

Password Security Questions

Security questions are used to verify the identity of a user to reset a password and regain access to OpenAir.

After this optional feature is enabled, new account users must set up security questions the first time they sign in to OpenAir and existing account users must set up security questions when they change your password.

After a user sets up security questions in OpenAir they can reset their password or unlock their user account without the intervention of an account administrator. To reset a password or unlock a user account, the user can click the **Reset password or unlock account** link on the OpenAir sign-in page and enter their Company ID, User ID and email address. If these details are verified, the user must answer a security challenge. If all questions are answered correctly, OpenAir sends a temporary password to the users's email address.

This feature reduces some of the administrative burden associated with unlocking user accounts.

For more information about using the Password Security Questions feature, see the help topics Setting Up Security Questions and Resetting Your OpenAir Password.



Note: Review the following guidelines:

- If you require answers to the security questions to have a minimum lengths, ask OpenAir Customer Support to change the minimum number of characters each answer must contain.
- System emails are disabled by default on sandbox accounts. The Forgot your password or ID? and Reset password or unlock account links can only be used on production accounts.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

Password Validation Against Known Compromised Passwords

Validate new passwords against a list of known compromised passwords when an employee attempts to change password.

When this optional feature is enabled for your account, OpenAir validates new passwords against a list of compromised passwords and will require users to enter a different password if the new password is on a regularly updated list of known compromised passwords.



Note: This is not applicable for temporary passwords set by administrators.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.



PI Removal

Let authorized users request and process the removal of personally identifiable information (PII) from employee, contact and customer records.

Personally identifiable information (PII) is data that can be used to determine a person's identity. Rules and regulations about PII vary by country, but usually include strict guidelines covering personal information acquisition, storage, and removal. The right to be forgotten is one of the key requirements in recent privacy laws, including in General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Administrators can use the PI Removal feature to replace the data stored in OpenAir with a standard value depending on the field type.

The PI Removal feature:

- Remove personal information (PI) from relevant standard, custom, and audit trail fields. See Supported Field Types and Fields.
- Improves compliance with privacy regulation.
- Permits an authorized user to remove personal information without contacting OpenAir Customer Support.

You can create, submit, and approve individual PI removal requests from within OpenAir. You can view all the requests that have been submitted, including who created the request, when it was created, and the current status of the request. See Reviewing, Creating, Submitting, Approving, Rejecting, or Canceling a PII Redaction Requests.

Submitted PI removal requests must be approved before they are queued for processing. OpenAir processes approved PI removal request automatically on a set day and time each week. PI removal requests approved in the last 72 hours at the time of processing are not processed immediately but the following week. This allows a minimum of 72 hours to cancel an approved PI removal request, should it be required.

After a PI removal request is processed, the PII is redacted permanently from OpenAir and the status of the PI removal request shows as completed. Users with the appropriate privileges can cancel the request at any time before its status shows as completed.

Email notifications are sent to users with the relevant access privilege. Employes who can approve PI removal requests receive an email notification when a request is submitted. Employees who can either create or approve PI removal requests receive an email notification when a request is approved, rejected, or canceled.

To enable this feature, contact OpenAir Customer Support.

User Privileges

The following user privileges are available for PI Removal feature:

- Allow employee to create PI removal requests User can view, create, edit, submit, duplicate and cancel requests.
- Allow employee to approve PI removal requests User can view, approve or reject, and cancel requests.

Account administrators who do not have either of these user privileges can view and cancel PI removal requests.



Note: By default, PI removal requests must be submitted and approved by different employees.

You should designate at least two employees to use the PI removal feature so that requests are created and approved by different employees.

You can allow the same employee to create and approve a PI removal request. To do so, contact OpenAir Customer Support and request the PII Redaction - Cumulative Create and Approve **Privileges** feature extension.

Supported Field Types and Fields

The PI Removal feature supports removal of information for the following field types. All redacted values are replaced with "*******, except where indicated otherwise in the following list.

Audit trail - Redacted value replaced by "PI Redacted by user.id <userId>" where <userId> is the internal ID for the employee who submitted the PI removal request.



Note: When the PI removal request is processed, OpenAir redacts only the audit trail information for the standard and custom fields that are redacted as part of the same PI removal request.

- Date Redacted value replaced by "1900-01-01"
- Datetime Redacted value replaced by "1900-01-01 00:00:00"
- Numeric Redacted value replaced by "0"
- Password (such as security answers, for example, if the Password Security Questions feature is enabled for your account – see Password Security Questions)
- Text
- Text area
- URL

Information in both standard and custom fields can be redacted. The following table lists the record types and fields you can remove information from.


Reviewing, Creating, Submitting, Approving, Rejecting, or Canceling a PII Redaction Requests

If the PI Removal feature is enabled for your company's OpenAir account, depending on your user privileges, you can review, create, submit, approve, reject, or cancel personally identifiable information (PII) redaction requests.


To review, create, submit, approve, reject, or cancel a PI removal request

1. Go to Administration > Global Settings > Organization > PII Removal (Administrator).

For each request, you can see the PI removal request name, the record type, when it was created, who created the request, who approved it, and the request status. The request status can be Open (request created but not submitted for approval), Submitted, Approved, Rejected, Terminated (approved request subsequently canceled), or Completed (request processed and information removed).



- 2. To view the details of each request, click the PI removal request name or the Edit icon under the Actions column. On the PI removal request form, you can see which records, and fields were, or are yet to be removed, and the redaction request includes the audit trail. If the request was not submitted, you can edit the request details.
- 3. To create a new PI removal request, click the Create button then New PI removal request. A form appears.
- 4. Select the type of record you want to redact information from, then click **Continue**. The PI removal request form appears.



- a. Enter a PI removal request name.
- b. Select the **Record** to redact information from.
 - The dropdown lists records identified by their internal ID in square brackets, followed by their Name (Employee records) or Nickname (Contacts and Customers).
- c. Select the Fields containing the information to be redacted. You can select multiple fields to be redacted at the same time.
- d. Check the **Redact audit trail** box if you want to redact the audit trail information.
- e. Click Save or Save and Submit. You cannot edit a PI removal request after you submit it.
- 5. To make a copy of a PI removal request, click the Clone icon 🕤 under the Actions column, change details as required on the PI removal request form, then click Save or Save and Submit.
- 6. To approve or reject a submitted PI removal request, click the PI removal request name then click Approve or Reject.
- 7. To cancel an approved PI removal request, go to the PI removal request and click **Terminate**. Canceled PI removal requests cannot be modified or resubmitted. To redact PII for the same record, create and submit a new PI removal request.
